SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2154 by House Committee on Health and Human Services

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2154 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2154 would repeal KSA 65-1627d, 65-1627e and 65-1627g. These statutes set out guidelines for filing petitions and serving notice to licensees of the Board of Pharmacy. These statutes conflict with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act.

The Kansas Board of Pharmacy currently follows the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act regarding hearing matters. Repealing these statutes would have no fiscal effect for the agency.
