Director Shelite introduced Dean Reynoldson, Manager of the Department of Revenue's Identity Security Unit and Office of Special Investigations. Mr. Reynoldson provided an informative overview of Driver's License fraud in the State of Kansas. Specific examples of fraudulent activities were detailed and then explained how the systems in place have lowered the risk and elevated the ability to detect, all in an effort to eliminate driver's license fraud.

Mr. Reynoldson provided examples of the current Kansas driver's license and identification cards used - pointing out that the new security features includes various layers of security, and indicated that Kansas has some of the most secure (from fraud) cards in the nation. No written testimony provided by Mr. Reynoldson. Question and answer period followed.
