

**Testimony on HB 2411 on Limiting the Review of Certain Rules and Regulations
by the Director of the Budget**

To

The House Committee on Federal and State Affairs

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HB 2411 pertains to limiting the review of certain rules and regulations by the director of the budget. **The Department supports the provisions contained in the bill and would request further amendments.** The provisions of the bill would be effective upon publication in the statute book.

HB 2411 would essentially limit the budget director's review of certain regulations to those meeting the minimum threshold of \$3,000,000 or because of federal mandate. The Department is supportive of this proposal but would suggest that the bill be further amended to begin the regulatory review process with the Department of Administration (DOA), followed by the Attorney General's Office (AG) and then the Division of Budget (DOB). The Department's proposal would result in significant personnel time savings. Currently, the regulations start at the DOB and then are transmitted to the DOA. If there are required changes to language in the already DOB approved regulations, the regulations must go back to the DOB for further review and then to the DOA. Once DOA has approved, then the AG reviews the language. Further changes to the language result in starting the approval process again, resulting in multiple reviews by both the DOB and the DOA. By changing the order the review process, maximum efficiency is achieved and the underlying purpose of the review process is still met, thereby resulting in savings to budgets and personnel time.
