Urban Indians are the special concern of the Mid-America All Indian Center in Wichita, Kansas. Early in 1974, the City of Wichita designated the center its primary Bicentennial project and committed land worth \$1 million along with \$2 million in construction and development funds. Dedicated on July 4, 1976, the center features a museum and library, a large multipurpose area called the Ceremonial Kiva and administrative offices. Visitors learn about Indian dwellings, the democratic government of America's first settlers, Indian poetry and foods. From career counseling and nutrition programs to powwows and classes in guilting, beading and leatherwork, the center will provide services to some 3,000 American Indians, members of 42 tribes in the Wichita area.
