Subject: SB 39—Division of Animal Health Renewal Deadlines

Senate Bill 39 would change the renewal deadline dates for certain registrations, permits and licenses relating to livestock and domestic animals from June 30 to September 30. Additionally, the bill would allow the animal health commissioner to require reimbursement for the actual cost of official calfhooD vaccination tags.

Deadline Renewals

The sections with renewal deadlines that would be changed to September 30 are:

1. K.S.A. 47-1001e and 47-1002: Licenses concerning the operation of a public livestock market;
2. K.S.A. 47-1208: All licenses and permits issued under chapter 47, article 12 relating to the disposal of dead animals;
3. K.S.A. 47-1503: Licenses to operate a feed lot;
4. K.S.A. 47-1805: Livestock dealer registration; and
5. K.S.A. 47-2101: Permits for the possession of domesticated deer.

Official CalfhooD Vaccination Tags

Currently, the cost for an official calfhooD vaccination tag cannot exceed \$0.25 for each tag. SB 39 would amend K.S.A. 47-1831 to allow the animal health commissioner to require reimbursement for the actual cost of official calfhooD vaccination tags. Additionally, the commissioner would have the option to charge a processing fee of up to \$0.25 for such tags.

Effective Date

SB 39 would be effective upon publication in the Kansas Register.
