The trunk transmits energy and the elements necessary for growth and gives strength and support to the leaves and branches. Things like—

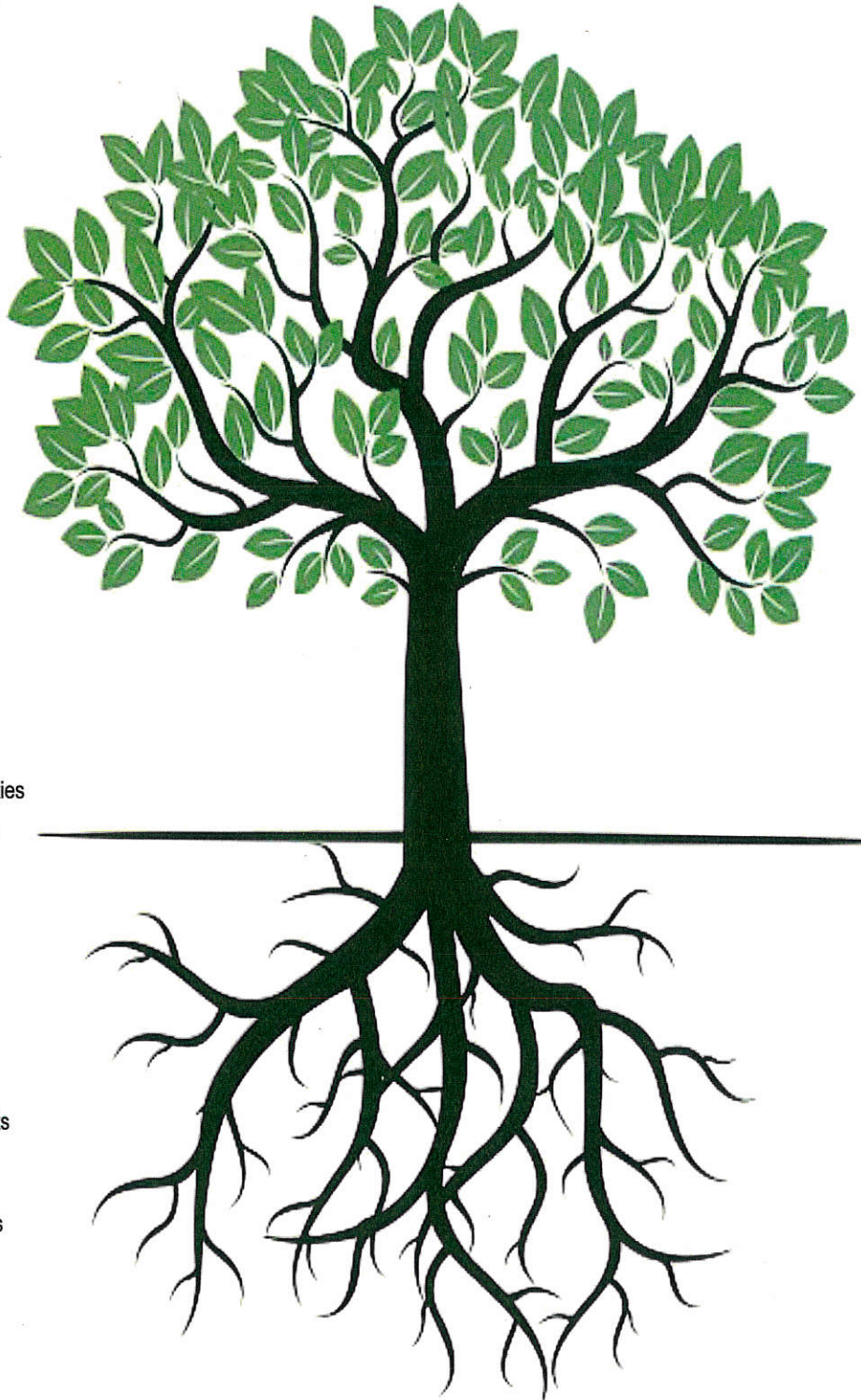
