SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2656 by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2656 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

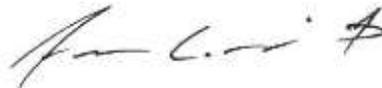
HB 2656 would require all Kansas law enforcement agencies to adopt a detailed, written policy to preempt motorcycle profiling in its policing. The bill would require the policy to be implemented by all Kansas law enforcement agencies prior to July 1, 2023, and include the following:

1. Provisions for discipline of law enforcement officers who engage in motorcycle profiling;
2. Procedures for individuals to file complaints of motorcycle profiling with the law enforcement agency; and,
3. A requirement for law enforcement officers to participate in motorcycle profiling training.

The bill would also require the annual report required to be submitted to the Office of the Attorney General by each law enforcement agency to include additional information as follows: (1) the number of motorcycle profiling complaints received; (2) action taken in response to each motorcycle profiling complaint received; (3) the disposition of each motorcycle profiling complaint received; and (4) whether or not all agency law enforcement officers have received motorcycle profiling training. Finally, HB 2656 would require policies and data collection procedures to be available for public inspection during normal business hours.

The Kansas Highway Patrol indicates the costs associated with updating policies and training material to incorporate the provisions of HB 2656 would be negligible as it already has policies in place related to bias-based policing and conducts annual training on the topic. The enactment of the bill would have a fiscal effect on local governments associated with required training, policy implementation, and annual reporting for law enforcement agencies. The Kansas Association of Counties indicates the fiscal effect would be negligible for counties and the League of Kansas Municipalities indicates the fiscal effect cannot be estimated. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2656 is not reflected in *The FY 2023 Governor's Budget Report*.
