SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 145 by Senate Committee on Ways and Means


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 145 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 145 would allow the Secretary of Wildlife, Parks, and Tourism to purchase land in Kingman County.

The Department of Wildlife, Parks, and Tourism states the property that would be purchased in FY 2021 is adjacent to Byron Walker Wildlife Area in Kingman County. The agency estimates the cost to purchase the property would be \$1,073,000 from the Wildlife Fee Fund in FY 2021, which matches the estimated appraisal of the property. The Department does indicate that there would be a cost to maintain the grounds; however, the estimate is unknown. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 145 is not reflected in *The FY 2022 Governor's Budget Report*.
