Chairman Thomas, Vice - Chairwoman Estes, Ranking Minority Member Stogsdill and members of the House Committee on Education:

Thank you for the opportunity to share our thoughts with you. HB 2223 would remove the sunset from the high-density, at-risk student weighting, which qualifying districts receive to provide at-risk best practice instruction to the districts' qualifying students.

For several years, this program has provided needed funds to qualifying school districts in addition to the funding formula. A sunset every two or three years has always been a part of the program. As a result, districts are unable to develop any long-term plans for the direction of the program. Removal of the sunset will give districts the opportunity to develop long-term plans for the delivery of effective, evidence-based educational services to students eligible to receive at-risk programs and services. We are aware that in a few years, the Kansas School Equity and Enhancement Act, of which the high-density, at-risk student weighting program is a part, will sunset. By removing the sunset from the high-density, at-risk student weighting, this will allow the opportunity for a more in-depth evaluation of the Kansas School Equity and Enhancement Act as well.
