Re: SEMA Support for HB 2783

Dear members of the Committee on Federal and State Affairs,

I am writing to express the strong support of the Specialty Equipment Market Association (SEMA) for HB 2783, which prohibits state agencies, cities, and counties from regulating or restricting the use or sale of motor vehicles based on their energy source. We believe that consumer choice and innovation are the cornerstones of a thriving automotive industry and that HB 2783 aligns perfectly with these principles.

SEMA represents over 7,000 American businesses, including 64 in Kansas, that manufacture and sell parts and accessories that improve motor vehicle performance, function, and style. While 95% of our member companies are small businesses, our industry's impact is massive, employing over 1.3 million Americans and contributing \$337 billion annually to the U.S. economy.

Here in Kansas, the industry contributes \$3.8 billion to the state's economy, employs over 16,000 individuals, generates over \$1 billion in wages and benefits, and \$462 million in taxes.

This bill empowers consumers to make informed decisions about the vehicles they purchase and operate, promoting a healthy and competitive marketplace.
