Chair Landwehr and Members of the committee,

I am writing my testimony in support of HB 2390 and thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony. HB 2390 is important to Public Health as it is a bill to establish an overdose fatality review board and excluding tests to detect the presence of fentanyl, ketamine or gamma hydroxybutric acid in a substance from the definition of drug paraphernalia.

Local health departments play a crucial role in responding to the opiod epidemic and part of that role is supporting various harm reduction activities. HB 2390 is a piece of legislation that can help reduce that harm as section 4 adds any materials used or intended to be used to test a substance for fentanyl or a fentanyl analog to the list of items that are not considered drug paraphernalia. CDC has noted that these Fentanyl test strips as a way to reduce harm and the legalization of these test strips is a low cost way of preventing drug overdoses and potentially death. I support the legalization of these test strips as just one more way to fight drug overdoses and drug associated deaths.
