Madam Chair Humphries and members of Judiciary,

My name is Lucrecia Nold, and I serve as the Policy Specialist for the Kansas Catholic Conference, representing the Catholic Bishops of Kansas. Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony as a PROPONENT to HB 2676.

Paragraph 2281 in the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Suicide contradicts the natural inclination of the human being to preserve and perpetuate his life. It is gravely contrary to the just love of self. It likewise offends love of neighbor because it unjustly breaks the ties of solidarity with family, nation, and other human societies to which we continue to have obligations. Suicide is contrary to love for the living God."

The Catholic Church not only recognizes the gravity of suicide but also that of assisted suicide. People struggling with the desire to end their own life need to be reminded of their value, worth and dignity. Thus, we are called to show compassion and love to those with suicidal thoughts, instead of aiding in their misguided desires. This is further shown by St. Augustine who states, "it is never licit to kill another: even if he should wish it..."
