I appreciate the Revenue Neutral Rate statute in that it provides a public forum to better express Consent (or disapproval) from the governed.

I'd like to express my approval of the additions of SB 468.

Our nation's founding principles of Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness are grounded in inalienable rights that all are subject to irrefutable natural laws for society including private property rights and 'Thou shall not steal'.
