AN ACT concerning education; relating to school districts; open enrollment; providing for continued enrollment of students who attend a school district of nonresidence; amending K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 72-3123 and repealing the existing section. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 72-3123 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-3123. (a) Beginning in school year 2024-2025, any child of school age pursuant to K.S.A. 72-3118, and amendments thereto, may attend a school operated by a school district where such child does not reside if such school district has open seats as determined pursuant to this section. (b) the board of education of any school district shall permit nonresident students to enroll in and attend the schools of the district if such school district has open seats as determined pursuant to this section. (e)(b) Each school district shall determine capacity in each school of the school district for the following school year as follows: (1) For kindergarten and grades one through eight, the classroom student-teacher ratio in each grade level; and (2) for grades nine through 12, the student-teacher ratio for each school building or program in each school building, including, but not limited to, advanced placement or international baccalaureate programs. (d)(c) (1) On or before May 1 of each year, each school board shall determine for each grade level in each school building of the school district for the next succeeding school year the: (A) Capacity as determined pursuant to subsection (c) (b); (B) number of students expected to attend school in the school district; and (C) number of open seats available to nonresident students. (2) On or before June 1 of each year, each school district shall publish on such school district's website the number of open seats available to nonresident students in each grade level for each school building of the school district for the next succeeding school year. (3) From June 1 through June 30, each school district shall accept applications from nonresident students. Applications shall be on a form

(g)(f)(1) A nonresident student who has been accepted for enrollment 2 3 and attendance at a receiving school district on or after June 1, 2024, shall be permitted to continue such enrollment and attendance in such school 5 district until such student graduates from high school, unless such student is deemed as no longer in good standing. 6 7 (2) A nonresident student who was enrolled in and attended a school 8 district of nonresidence during school year 2023-2024 shall be permitted 9 to continue such enrollment and attendance in such school district until such student graduates from high school, unless such student is deemed as 10 no longer in good standing. (g) A receiving school district may deem-a any nonresident student as 12 not in good standing in accordance with such school district's nonresident 13 transfer policy. Prior to making any determination to deem a nonresident 14 student as not in good standing, a district shall consider a student's status 15 as a homeless child and the resulting factors of homelessness on such 16 17 student's standing. 18 (h) A student may always enroll at any time in the school district 19 where such student resides. 20 (i) Except for a child in the custody of the department for children and families or a child who is experiencing homelessness, a nonresident 22 student shall not transfer more than once per school year to one or more 23 receiving school districts pursuant to the provisions of this section. 24 (j) a receiving school district shall not be required to provide transportation to nonresident students. If space is available on school 25 district transportation vehicles, a school district may provide nonresident 26 students an in-district bus stop where transportation may be provided by 27 28 such school district to and from such bus stop and the school for such nonresident students. A school district shall ensure that transportation for 29 30 nonresident homeless students is provided comparably to that of housed 31 students. (k) Each school district board of education shall submit to the state 32 department of education the school district's policy adopted pursuant to 33 34 K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 72-3126, and amendments thereto, the number of nonresident student transfers approved and denied by such board in each 35 36 grade level and whether the denials were based on capacity or in accordance with the policy adopted pursuant to K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 72-37 3126. and amendments thereto. The state department of education shall 38 collect and report such data on such department's website and make such 39 data available to the legislative division of post audit. 40

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41 (1) (1) Each year, the state department of education, as part of the department's enrollment audit, shall audit the nonresident student capacity 42 and enrollment. 43
