Subject: SCR 1607 – Making application to Congress to call a convention of the

states pursuant to Article V of the Constitution of the United States.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 1607 (SCR 1607) is a concurrent resolution making application to the U.S. Congress to call a convention of the states for the purpose of proposing amendments to the U.S. Constitution. Article V of the U.S. Constitution grants Congress the authority to propose amendments to the U.S. Constitution. Alternatively, Article V directs Congress to call a convention of the states for such purpose if $^2/_3$ of the states (34 states) apply to Congress to call such a convention. Any amendments proposed at a convention of the states must then be ratified by $^3/_4$ of the states (38 states) to become effective.

SCR 1607 calls for a convention of the states for the purpose of proposing amendments that would:

- Place fiscal restraints on the federal government;
- Place limits on the power and jurisdiction of the federal government; and
- Place term limits on federal offices and members of Congress.

Pursuant to Article 2, § 13 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, SCR 1607 must be approved by a $^2/_3$ majority of both the Senate and the House of Representatives to become effective.
