I am writing in support of SB 366. Mail ballot applications and mail ballots are the softest target for malfeasance during an election because there are no laws governing their chain of custody, no real way to verify the signature on the application or ballot is that of the voter and with ballot harvesting operations in effect all over the country, it increases the likelihood of fraud.

The signatures on both the application and absentee ballot envelope should be notarized to prevent fraud as is evidenced to have happened in this Rasmussen poll: https://gvwire.com/2023/12/13/mail-in-voting-fraud-exposed-in-recent-rasmussen-survey/.

Also, section n) should be stricken and the types/forms of ID that can be used should be codified into statute instead of leaving it up to the Secretary of State to decide.

All voting should be done on one day, in person, on paper and the ballot counting should be live streamed and done by hand so the People can verify the outcome. The current black box voting systems we use are antithetical to democratic principles, an affront to our Constitutional Republic and violative of the Constitution's Equal Protection and Due Process clauses. Every effort by the legislature should be geared towards achieving a more robust, transparent, reliable and trustworthy election-- SB 366 is a good step in that direction.
