Chairman Thompson and Committee Members, the Greater Topeka Chamber and Visit Topeka comprise the Greater Topeka Partnership. Our partnership's focus is economic vitality for our region. To that end, we are writing today in support of SB511, Permitting Beer and Hard Cider Sales.

The microbrewery industry has seen tremendous growth over the past few years. Based on 2022 data, this sector contributes \$72.2 Billion to our national economy. Most craft breweries are small and independently owned businesses.

Trends indicate that more and more people are turning micro-brewers into a destination, more commonly known as Brew Tourism. With several individuals coming from neighboring states and even abroad. In Kansas specifically, the economic impact made by the brewery industry is just shy of \$520 million.
