Subject: HB 2783 – Prohibiting government regulation of the use or sale of motor

vehicles based on fuel source.

House Bill No. 2783 (HB 2783) would create new state law to prohibit the state, cities and counties from regulating or restricting the use or sale of motor vehicles based on the energy source used to power such vehicles.

Under HB 2783, no state agency or any city or county could regulate or restrict motor vehicle use or sales based on the energy source used to power such vehicles. A state agency, city or county could still adopt policies and procedures for the purchase and use of motor vehicles by such agency or municipality that could be based on the energy source of the vehicle.

HB 2783 passed in the House on a final action vote of 89-30.

If enacted, HB 2783 would become effective on July 1, 2024.
