Mr. Chairman and committee

I have spent 10 years coming here advocating for cannabis liberty. I have 1.4 acres available to me for production and as a citizen of Kansas, a sovereign state, I should have the reservation to plant any seed- bearing plant as a fundamental and natural right to be defended by those who appropriate my tax money and allow individual liberty, self-reliance, limited government and the free market to prevail, not fear and loathing like subjects under a king.

However, I support this bill because it is the most counter-intuitive thing to do so as not to give the big government prohibitionists more ammunition in their fight against this plant.
