- The communications I just read were from October...
- Interestingly, Dr. Kellogg authored a study on the failures of the control measures adopted during the epidemic.
- History truly does repeat itself. Other than a few time-period specific words, the description of the public health response...could also describe the public health response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- More and more Americans are waking up to the fact that the response to the pandemic was an abject failure.
- Our public health officials had no high quality, statistically significant evidence that masking, quarantining or lockdowns would work, yet they proceeded with these ineffective control measures.
- The question is why? During Dr. Kellogg’s time, public health succumbed to fear, but public health during modern times has become political.
- Whether influenced by fear or politics, when responding to a health crisis, public health will by...
- As it stands right now, Chapter 65 – Article 1 gives the Secretary of KDHE and other public health officials the power to prohibit public gatherings, order quarantines, quarantine the unvaccinated, adopt new rules and regulations and even order the sheriff to enforce their orders.
