Subject: Senate Bill No. 476

Summary

Senate Bill No. 476 creates a new traffic infraction for individuals found guilty driving faster than 100 miles per hour. Such individuals would be guilty of excessive speeding. Penalties for guilty violations would be:

- (1) Upon a first conviction of a violation, a person shall be restricted in driving for 15 days after the conviction.
- (2) Upon a second conviction of a violation within three years after a prior conviction, a person shall be restricted in driving for 30 days after the conviction.
- (3) Upon a third conviction of a violation within three years after a prior conviction, a person's driving privileges shall be suspended for 30 days.

A person whose driving privileges were restricted would only be able to drive under the following circumstances:

- (1) In going to or returning from the person's place of employment or schooling;
- (2) in the course of the person's employment;
- (3) in going to or returning from an appointment with a healthcare provider or during a medical emergency; and
- (4) in going to and returning from probation or parole meetings, drug or alcohol counseling or any place the person is required to go by a court.
