Senate Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee Rules - 2024

- 1. In any case where committee rules do not apply, Senate Rules shall govern. All powers, duties and responsibilities not addressed herein are reserved to the Chair.
- 2. Cell phones and other electronic devises are to be turned off unless audible tones and ringers are disabled/silenced while in the committee room.
- 3. All committee seating is assigned by the Committee Chair.
- 4. The Chair shall determine the committee agenda, including scheduling and the order of business. Any item listed on the agenda may be removed at any time by the Chair.
- 5. Persons wishing to appear before the committee must provide twenty-five (25) copies of written testimony to the Committee Assistant no later than 12:00 (noon) on the <u>day prior</u> to the committee meeting in which the person wishes to appear.
- 6. The Chair reserves the right to limit testimony that is cumulative in nature and may limit testimony, when necessary, to a specific number of minutes.
- 7. Committee members shall not interrupt or address conferees until and unless permission is granted by the Chair.
- 8. Questioning of conferees shall be limited to the subject matter on the agenda for the day, except as otherwise may be allowed by the Chair.
- 9. Committee members are expected to address conferees by their title (i.e. Senator, Representative, Secretary, Commissioner, Mr., Mrs., etc.).
- 10. The Chair reserves the right to limit questioning of conferees by committee members in the interest of time and in the interest of fairness to conferees and other committee members.
- 11. No bill or resolution shall be taken up for a vote unless announced by the Chair. The Chair may bring up any bill previously heard for discussion and possible vote at any time.
- 12. After a motion to pass out favorably or not favorably is seconded, the committee may consider amendments to the main motion.
- 13. A substitute motion is in order, but no additional substitute motion shall be in order until the prior substitute motion is disposed of.
- 14. A motion to lay on the table shall be in order only when such item is on the agenda or is taken up by the Chair. The motion requires a simple majority of those present to pass. Unless determined by the Chair, such motion is non-debatable.
- 15. A motion to "take from the table" shall not be in order unless the item is on the agenda or taken up by the Chair. The motion requires a second and is debatable.
- 16. Committee members shall not be approached during a committee meeting by anyone other than fellow legislators or legislative staff.
- 17. A request from any member to have their vote recorded shall be granted.
- 18 The Chair reserves the right to take such action as deemed necessary to prevent disruptive behavior in the committee room during hearings and deliberations.
- 19. Adjournment is reserved to the Chair.
