Substitute for HOUSE BILL No. 2494

AN ACT concerning school districts; relating to emergency response
 policies; establishing requirements for cardiac emergency response
 plans; creating the school cardiac emergency response grant fund.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

6 Section 1. (a) The secretary of health and environment shall develop 7 statewide standards for cardiac emergency response plans. Such standards 8 shall be developed in accordance with nationally recognized guidelines for 9 implementation of cardiac emergency response plans as promulgated by 10 organizations focused on emergency cardiovascular care.

11 (b) The board of education of each school district shall adopt a 12 comprehensive cardiac emergency response plan, including policies and 13 procedures for cardiac emergency responses for each attendance center operated by the school district, based on the statewide standards developed 14 by the secretary under subsection (a). The board may utilize any materials, 15 documentation, video recordings, training modules and certifications 16 published by organizations focused on emergency cardiovascular care. The 17 cardiac emergency response plan shall include, but is not limited to, the 18 19 following:

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(1) Establishing of a cardiac emergency response team;

(2) identifying and implementing the placement of automatedexternal defibrillators;

(3) identifying roles and responsibilities of school district personnel,
 local law enforcement agencies and local emergency medical services in
 implementing the cardiac emergency response plan;

(4) establishing procedures, including the roles and responsibilities of school district personnel when responding to incidents involving an individual experiencing a suspected sudden cardiac arrest while attending school or at the site of any school-sponsored athletic practice or competition or other school-sponsored activity located in this state whether such site is located on the grounds of the school district or at another location, including, but not limited to:

(A) Responding to individuals experiencing a suspected sudden
 cardiac arrest;

- (B) summoning emergency medical services;
- 36 (C) assisting emergency medical service providers; and

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(D) documenting actions taken during such incident;

2 (5) conducting routine maintenance of automated external 3 defibrillators, including appropriate placement in accordance with the 4 statewide standards;

5 (6) designating school district personnel for training in the use of 6 automated external defibrillators and cardiopulmonary resuscitation 7 during a cardiac emergency;

8 (7) rehearsing cardiac emergency response plans, by simulation, by 9 all athletic directors, coaches, assistant coaches, athletic trainers, school 10 nurses and any other school district personnel designated pursuant to 11 paragraph (6) either prior to the beginning of each athletic season or prior 12 to the beginning of each school year;

(8) establishing communication systems with local emergencymedical services operating within the school district; and

15 (9) developing a cardiac emergency action plan for school-sponsored 16 events held at a location that is not on school district property.

(c) Each board of education shall annually review the cardiacemergency response plan and adopt any changes to such plan as necessary.

(d) Each school district shall submit a copy of the adopted cardiac
emergency response plan to the secretary of health and environment. If the
board of education of such district adopts any changes to such plan, a copy
of the amended plan shall be submitted to the secretary.

23 (a) Each school district shall provide a copy of such district's Sec. 2. 24 cardiac emergency response plan to the appropriate local law enforcement 25 agencies, emergency medical services and all school district personnel. Prior to the first instructional day of each school year, a school building 26 administrator shall review the cardiac emergency response plan with all 27 28 school personnel at each school operated by the school district. The time 29 and date of such review shall be documented as part of the plan. After the 30 last instructional day of each school year, the cardiac emergency response 31 plan shall be revised by all school building administrators, school nurses 32 and appropriate local law enforcement officers and emergency medical 33 services personnel.

(b) In accordance with the school district's cardiac emergency response plan, each school district shall maintain an automated external defibrillator in a public and readily accessible location in each school district building used for student attendance purposes. Such locations shall have conspicuous signs indicating the location of each automated external defibrillator.

40 (c) Each coach, including any head coach, assistant coach or aide, any
41 sponsor, including the head sponsor, assistant or aide, of any activity, as
42 defined in K.S.A. 72-7117, and amendments thereto, and any other school
43 district personnel designated pursuant to section 1(b)(6), and amendments

thereto, shall receive annual training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automated external defibrillator administration. At least one individual with such training shall be in attendance at each school-sponsored athletic practice or competition or other school-sponsored activity that occurs in any school district building used for student attendance purposes with access to an automated external defibrillator and first aid supplies. Such training shall be annually reviewed and modified as necessary.

8 (d) Any person who in good faith renders emergency care or 9 treatment pursuant to this section or who provides training as required by 10 this section shall not be held liable for any damages as provided in K.S.A. 11 65-6149a, and amendments thereto.

Sec. 3. The board of education of a school district shall implement the cardiac emergency response plan adopted pursuant to section 1, and amendments thereto, as the school district has sufficient unencumbered funds available to implement such plan. A cardiac emergency response plan may be partially implemented as funds are available and as deemed necessary by the board of education.

18 Sec. 4. (a) There is hereby established the school cardiac emergency 19 response grant program to be administered by the department of health and environment. Each school district may submit an application to the 20 21 secretary of health and environment in such form and manner as 22 prescribed by the secretary for an amount of grant moneys needed by such 23 school district to implement such school district's cardiac emergency 24 response plan adopted pursuant to section 1, and amendments thereto. 25 Each grant application shall include a copy of the current school district 26 cardiac emergency response plan, including all policies and procedures 27 adopted for the implementation of such plan, and a description of the 28 school improvements that the school district determines are necessary for 29 such implementation. The secretary shall review all submitted applications 30 and approve or deny such applications based on whether the applicant 31 school district has demonstrated the necessity of the school improvements 32 described in the application. If the secretary approves an application, the 33 secretary shall determine the amount of moneys to be disbursed to the 34 applicant school district from the school cardiac emergency response grant 35 fund. If the secretary denies an application, then, within 15 days of such 36 denial, the secretary shall send written notice of such denial to the 37 superintendent of such school district.

(b) There is hereby established in the state treasury the school cardiac
emergency response grant fund to be administered by the department of
health and environment. All expenditures from the school cardiac
emergency response grant fund shall be used for the disbursement of grant
moneys for school improvements in accordance with this section and shall
be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the

- 1 director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by
- 2 the secretary of health and environment or the secretary's designee. Upon
- 3 receipt of such grant moneys, the school district treasurer shall deposit the
- 4 amount of such award in the general fund of the school district.
- 5 Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after 6 January 1, 2025, and its publication in the statute book.
