AN ACT concerning education; relating to the state board of education; 1 2 authorizing teaching licenses for individuals who complete an alternative teacher certification program. 3 4 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. (a) The state board of education shall authorize any 6 7 individual who has completed an alternative teacher certification program 8 to apply for and obtain an initial a restricted teaching license subject to the requirements of this section. Such applicant shall not be required to 9 comply with either of the following requirements as a prerequisite to-10 obtaining a teaching license pursuant to this section: 11 (1) Complete a professional education pedagogy coursework at an-12 accredited college or university engaged in teacher preparation; or 13 14 (2) hold a valid teaching license in another state that was earned-15 through completion of an alternative teacher certification program. 16 (b) An applicant who applies for-an-initial a restricted teaching 17 license pursuant to this section shall: (1) Submit an official transcript confirming the granting of a 18 19 bachelor's degree or higher in any field of study from a college or 20 university that has an accreditation recognized by the state board of 21 education: 22 (2) submit proof of completion of the alternative teacher certification 23 program and a passing score on a subject area examination approved by the state board of education or a praxis test; 24 25 (3) submit an application for an initial a restricted license with the 26 required licensure fee; and 27 (4) complete all background check requirements; and 28 (5) comply with any other requirements established by the state 29 board of education that are comparable to other licensing 30 requirements established by the state board. 31 (c) An applicant who obtains an initial a restricted teaching license 32 pursuant to this section shall be authorized to teach the subject area and 33 educational level that correspond to the certification received through the

2 program, including:

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- (1) Elementary education;
- (2) elementary education with a reading endorsement unified;
- 5 (3) English language arts;
- 6 (4) United States and world history, government and social studies;
- 7 (5) mathematics;
- 8 (6) general science;
- 9 (7) biology;
- 10 (8) chemistry;
- 11 (9) physics;-and
- 12 (10) secondary education unified; and
 - (11) high-incidence and low-incidence special education.
- (d) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), Prior to the granting of
 an initial teaching license to any applicant pursuant to this section, the
 state board of education may establish and grant to any suchindividual a restricted or probationary teaching license while suchindividual completes any mentorship program required pursuant to
 paragraph (3).
- 20 (2) The state board shall treat an individual who successfully-21 completes a mentorship program under a restricted or probationary-22 teaching license and any individual who obtains an initial teaching-23 license pursuant to this section in the same manner as an individual who 24 completes a traditional teacher preparation program and receives an initial 25 teaching license, including during the process of converting such initial 26 teaching license to another license type.
- (2)(3) The state board may require An individual who obtains or 27 28 seeks to obtain an initial a restricted teaching license pursuant to this 29 section-to shall participate in a school district-based teacher mentorship program during the first-year two years such person is employed by a 30 school district in this state. As part of such school district-based teacher 31 32 mentorship program, the school district board of education shall 33 submit a progress report each year to the state board of education, on 34 a form and in the manner required by the state board, to verify that 35 the individual has made appropriate progress toward full licensure.
- 36 (2) If appropriate progress has been made toward full licensure at 37 the end of the two-year mentorship, an individual who holds a 38 restricted teaching license pursuant to this section shall be authorized 39 to apply for and may obtain a full Kansas teaching license. Such 30 individual shall be treated in the same manner as an individual who 41 completes a traditional teacher preparation program.
- 42 (3) If appropriate progress is not made toward full licensure, the 43 state board may cancel the restricted license.

1 (e) The state board of education shall adopt rules and regulations 2 necessary to carry out this section.

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3 (f) As used in this section, "alternative teacher certification program"
 4 means a teacher preparation program that:

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- (1) Operates in at least five states;
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(2) has been in operation for at least 10 years;(3) includes subject-area content training and pedagogical training

7 (3) includes subject-area content training and pedagogical training
8 that covers effective instructional delivery, classroom management and
9 organization, assessment, instructional design and professional learning
10 and leadership; and

11 (4) requires applicants to pass a subject area examination and a 12 pedagogy examination to successfully complete the program.
