AN ACT concerning drivers' licenses; relating to farm permits; allowing
 farm permit holders beginning at age-14 15 to drive to and from
 religious activities held by any religious organization; amending K.S.A.
 8-296 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 8-296 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-296.
(a) Any person who is less than 17 years of age but is at least 14 years of
age and who resides upon a farm in this state or is employed for
compensation upon a farm in this state may apply to the division of
vehicles for a farm permit authorizing such person, while possessing the
permit, to operate any motor vehicle in class C, as designated in K.S.A. 8234b, and amendments thereto.

(b) (1) A farm permit shall entitle the licensee, who is at least 14
years of age, but less than 16 15 years of age, to operate the appropriate
motor vehicles at any time:

(A) While going to or from or in connection with any farm job,employment or other farm-related work;

(B) on days while school is in session, over the most direct and
 accessible route between the licensee's residence and school of enrollment
 for the purpose of school attendance; oror

(C) from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. while going directly to or from any religious
 activity held by a religious organization; or

(D) when the licensee is operating a passenger car at any time when
 accompanied by an adult who is the holder of a valid commercial driver's
 license, class A, B or C driver's license and who is actually occupying a
 seat beside the driver.

(2) A farm permit shall entitle the licensee who is at least 15 years
 of age but less than 16 years of age to operate the appropriate motor
 vehicles at any time:

(A) While going to or from or in connection with any farm job,
employment or other farm-related work;

(B) on days while school is in session, over the most direct and
 accessible route between the licensee's residence and school of
 enrollment for the purpose of school attendance;

1 (C) from 6 a.m. through 9 p.m. while going directly to or from 2 any religious activity held by a religious organization; or

3 (D) when the licensee is operating a passenger car and 4 accompanied by an adult who is the holder of a valid commercial 5 driver's license, class A, B or C driver's license and who is actually 6 occupying a seat beside the driver.

7 (2)(3) (A) For a period of six months, a farm permit shall entitle the 8 licensee who is at least 16 years of age to operate the appropriate motor 9 vehicles at any time:

(A)(*i*) From 5:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.;

(B)(*ii*) while going to or from or in connection with any farm job,
 employment or other farm-related work;-or

(C)(iii) while going to or from authorized school activities;

14 (D)(iv) while going directly to or from any religious worship service 15 *activity* held by a religious organization; or

16 (E)(v) when the licensee is operating a passenger car at any time 17 when accompanied by an adult who is the holder of a valid commercial 18 driver's license, class A, B or C driver's license and who is actually 19 occupying a seat beside the driver.

20 (B) After such six-month period, if the licensee has complied with the 21 provisions of this section, such farm permit shall entitle the licensee to 22 operate the appropriate motor vehicles at any time without the restrictions 23 required by this section.

(c) A farm permit shall be issued only if:

(1) The applicant can prove that such applicant resides or works on afarm;

(2) the applicant has successfully completed the examination
 requirements in K.S.A. 8-235d, and amendments thereto; and

(3) the applicant submits the signed affidavit of either a parent or guardian, stating that the applicant lives on a farm or, if the applicant does not live on a farm but works on a farm, the applicant submits the signed affidavit of the applicant's employer and parent or guardian, attesting to such employment.

(d) (1) Any licensee issued a farm permit under this section who is:

35 (1)(A) Who is Less than 16 years of age shall not operate any motor 36 vehicle with nonsibling minor passengers; or

37 (2)(B) who is at least 16 years of age, for a period of six months after 38 reaching 16 years of age, shall not operate any motor vehicle with more 39 than one passenger who is less than 18 years of age and who is not a 40 member of the licensee's immediate family.

41 *(2)* Any conviction for violating this subsection shall be construed as 42 a moving traffic violation for the purpose of K.S.A. 8-255, and 43 amendments thereto. 1 (e) Any licensee issued a farm permit under this section shall not 2 operate a wireless communication device while driving a motor vehicle, 3 except that a licensee may operate a wireless communication device while 4 driving a motor vehicle to report illegal activity or to summons medical or 5 other emergency help.

6 (f) As used in this section, "farm" means any parcel of land larger 7 than 20 acres-which *that* is used in agricultural operations.

8 (g) (1) A farm permit issued under this section is subject to 9 suspension or revocation in the same manner as any other driver's license.

10 (2) A farm permit shall be suspended in accordance with K.S.A. 8-11 291, and amendments thereto, for any violation of restrictions under this 12 section.

(3) The division shall suspend the farm permit upon receiving
 satisfactory evidence that the licensee has been involved in two or more
 accidents chargeable to the licensee and such suspended license shall not
 be reinstated for one year.

17 (h) (1) Any licensee issued a farm permit under this section shall 18 provide prior to reaching 16 years of age, a signed affidavit of either a 19 parent or guardian, stating that the applicant has completed at least 50 10 hours of adult supervised driving with at least 10 of those hours being at 11 night. The adult supervised driving required by this paragraph shall be 12 conducted by an adult who is at least 21 years of age and is the holder of a 13 valid commercial driver's license, class A, B or C driver's license.

(2) Evidence of failure of any licensee who was required to complete
 the 50 hours of adult supervised driving under this subsection shall not be
 admissible in any action for the purpose of determining any aspect of
 comparative negligence or mitigation of damages.

(i) Any licensee issued a farm permit under this section who:

(1) Is under the age of 16 years and is convicted of two or more
moving traffic violations committed on separate occasions shall not be
eligible to receive a driver's license-which *that* is not restricted in
accordance with the provisions of subsection (b)(1), until the person
reaches 17 years of age;

(2) is at least 16 years of age, but less than 17 years of age and is
convicted of two or more moving traffic violations committed on separate
occasions shall not be eligible to receive a driver's license-which *that* is not
restricted in accordance with the provisions of subsection (b)(2), until the
person reaches 18 years of age; or

(3) fails to provide the affidavit required under subsection (h), shall
not be eligible to receive a driver's license-which *that* is not restricted in
accordance with the provisions of subsection (b)(1), until the person
provides such affidavit to the division or the person reaches 17 years of
age, whichever occurs first.
