AN ACT concerning health professions and practices; relating to the regulation of dentists; Kansas dental board; requiring a dentist to establish a bona fide relationship with a patient before providing dental services; prohibiting dental service contracts that limit a patient's ability to file a complaint with the board; updating certain provisions of the Kansas dental practices act; amending K.S.A. 65-1430 and 65-1467 and repealing the existing sections.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b), a dentist shall establish a bona fide relationship with a patient before providing services to such patient. A bona fide relationship between a patient and a dentist shall exist if the dentist has:

- (1) Reviewed the patient's relevant diagnostic dental records, medical history, dental history and prescription history;
- (2) performed an appropriate, in-person examination of the patient for the purpose of diagnosing, assessing, developing a treatment plan or determining the patient's current medical or dental condition;
- (3) reviewed radiographs or appropriate bone imaging taken within the preceding six months for treatment for the correction of malposition of human teeth or initial use of an orthodontic appliance; and
- (4) discussed a reasonable expectation to provide follow-up care and treatment to the patient.
- (b) The provisions of this section shall not apply to a dentist providing services to a patient without remuneration or to the practice of dental hygiene under the delegation and supervision of a dentist as provided under K.S.A. 65-1456(e) through (i), and amendments thereto.
- (c) The provisions of this section shall be a part of and supplemental to the Kansas dental practices act.
- Sec. 2. K.S.A. 65-1430 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-1430. Every practitioner of dentistry within the meaning of this act shall post and keep conspicuously displayed the dentist's name, license and current license renewal certificate in each office in which the dentist practices, in plain sight of patients, and if there is more than one dentist practicing or employed in any office, the manager or proprietor of such

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office shall post or display, or cause to be posted and displayed, in like manner the name and license of each dentist so practicing or employed in such office. If a licensed dentist is providing dental services outside a dental office, each patient of such dentist shall be provided with such dentist's name, contact telephone number, after hours contact information for emergencies and, upon the patient's request, such dentist's license information.

- Sec. 3. K.S.A. 65-1467 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-1467. (a) Any complaint or report, record or other information relating to a complaint—which that is received, obtained or maintained by the Kansas dental board shall be confidential and shall not be disclosed by the board or its employees in a manner—which that identifies or enables identification of the person who is the subject or source of the information except the information may be disclosed:
- (1) In any proceeding conducted by the board under the law or in an appeal of an order of the board entered in a proceeding, or to any party to a proceeding or appeal or the party's attorney;
- (2) to the person who is the subject of the information or to any person or entity when requested by the person who is the subject of the information,—but except that the board may require disclosure in such a manner that will prevent identification of any other person who is the subject or source of the information; or
- (3) to a state or federal licensing, regulatory or enforcement agency with jurisdiction over the subject or the information or to an agency with jurisdiction over acts or conduct similar to acts or conduct which that would constitute grounds for action under this act. Any confidential complaint or report, record or other information disclosed by the board as authorized by this section shall not be redisclosed by the receiving agency except as otherwise authorized by law.
- (b) A dentist or contract for dental services shall not require a patient to sign an agreement that attempts to limit the patient's ability to file a complaint with the Kansas dental board.
- (c) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to the Kansas dental practices act.
 - Sec. 4. K.S.A. 65-1430 and 65-1467 are hereby repealed.
- Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
