11 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2024, June 30, 2025, and June 30, 2026, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, capital improvement projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in this act.

(b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate
and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized by
this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to the
restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

Sec. 159. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 82a-955 is hereby amended to read as follows: 82a-955. (a) On July 1,2023 2024 and July 1, 2025, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer \$35,000,000 from the state general fund to the state water plan fund. It is the intent of the legislature to provide for the transfer of \$35,000,000 from the state general fund to the state water plan fund on July 1, 2024, July 1, 2025, July 1, 2026, and July 1, 2027.

(b) (1) The state water plan fund shall continue to be appropriated and
expended for the purposes prescribed in K.S.A. 82a-951, and amendments
thereto, except that if an appropriation is made for any fiscal year as
intended in subsection (a), on July 1 of such fiscal year, or as soon
thereafter on such dates as moneys are available:

43 (A) \$5,000,000 shall be transferred from the state water plan fund to

the water technical assistance fund established in K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 82a 956, and amendments thereto; and

3 (B) \$12,000,000 shall be transferred from the state water plan fund to 4 the water projects grant fund established in K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 82a-957, 5 and amendments thereto.

6 (2) The provisions of this section shall expire on July 1, 2028. On July 1, 2028, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer all moneys 8 in the water technical assistance fund and the water projects grant fund to 9 the state water plan fund and all liabilities of the water technical assistance 10 fund and the water projects grant fund shall be imposed upon the state 11 water plan fund. On July 1, 2028, the water technical assistance fund and 12 the water projects grant fund shall be abolished.

13 (c) (1) (A) Notwithstanding any restrictions in K.S.A. 82a-951, and amendments thereto, the Kansas water authority may recommend to the 14 legislature the appropriation of up to 10% of the unencumbered balance of 15 16 the state water plan fund to be used to supplement salaries of existing state 17 agency full-time equivalent employees and for funding new full-time 18 equivalent positions created to implement the state water plan. Moneys 19 from such appropriation may be used to supplement existing positions, but 20 such moneys shall not be used to replace state general fund moneys, any 21 fee fund moneys or other funding for positions existing on July 1, 2023.

(B) Eligible full-time equivalent positions that moneys may be used
 for pursuant to this paragraph include engineers, geologists, hydrologists,
 environmental scientists, attorneys, resource planners, grant specialists and
 any other similar positions.

(2) If at least two conservation districts present a joint proposal to the
Kansas water authority for a position or positions to provide shared
services to all districts involved in such proposal, the Kansas water
authority may recommend that moneys be used to supplement the salary or
salaries of such position or positions pursuant to paragraph (1).

(3) The Kansas water authority shall encourage funding requests from
state and local entities that cooperate with qualified nonprofit entities on
projects that provide a direct benefit to water quantity and quality,
including water infrastructures that are both natural and constructed, and
include matching funds from non-state sources.

36 (4) The Kansas water authority may direct the Kansas water office to 37 provide funding pursuant to K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 82a-956 or 82a-957, and 38 amendments thereto, for the improvement of water infrastructure in an 39 unincorporated area related to or serving a national park site or state 40 historic site if the request for funding is made by a nonprofit organization 41 or state agency that is willing to administer the moneys and oversee the 42 project, and the Kansas water authority deems such applicant capable of 43 successfully managing the project. Upon receipt of such a request, the

1 Kansas water office may award moneys in any fiscal year prior to July 1,

2 2028, with such awarding of moneys to be made at the discretion of the3 Kansas water office.

4 (5) The Kansas water authority shall encourage the creation of grant 5 programs for stockwatering conservation projects. Such grant programs 6 shall prioritize the use of fees collected pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-954(a)(3), 7 and amendments thereto.

8 (d) All reporting requirements established in K.S.A. 82a-951, and 9 amendments thereto, shall continue and such reporting requirements shall 10 apply to the water technical assistance fund established in K.S.A. 2023 11 Supp. 82a-956, and amendments thereto, and the water projects grant fund 12 established in K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 82a-957, and amendments thereto.

Sec. 160. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 2-223, 12-1775a, 12-5256, 65-180, 7450,107, 74-99b34, 76-775, 76-7,107, 79-2959, 79-2964, 79-2989, 793425i, 79-34,171 and 82a-955 are hereby repealed.

Sec. 161. If any fund or account name described by words and the numerical accounting code that follows such fund or account name do not match, it shall be conclusively presumed that the legislature intended that the fund or account name described by words is the correct fund or account name, and such fund or account name described by words shall control over a contradictory or incorrect numerical accounting code.

Sec. 162. *Severability*. If any provision or clause of this act or application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

Sec. 163. Appeals to exceed expenditure limitations. (a) Upon written
application to the governor and approval of the state finance council,
expenditures from special revenue funds may exceed the amounts
specified in this act.

(b) This section shall not apply to the expanded lottery act revenues
fund, the state economic development initiatives fund, the children's
initiative fund, the state water plan fund or the Kansas endowment for
youth fund, or to any account of any such funds.

Sec. 164. *Savings.* (a) Any unencumbered balance as of June 30, 2024, in any special revenue fund, or account thereof, of any state agency named in this act that is not otherwise specifically appropriated or limited for fiscal year 2025 by this or any other appropriation act of the 2024 regular session of the legislature is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, for the same use and purpose as the same was heretofore appropriated.

42 (b) This section shall not apply to the expanded lottery act revenues 43 fund, the state economic development initiatives fund, the children's initiatives fund, the state water plan fund, the Kansas endowment for youth
 fund, the Kansas educational building fund, the state institutions building

fund or the correctional institutions building fund, or to any account of anyof such funds.

5 Sec. 165. During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, all moneys 6 that are lawfully credited to and available in any bond special revenue 7 fund and that are not otherwise specifically appropriated or limited by this 8 or other appropriation act of the 2024 regular session of the legislature are 9 hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, for the state 10 agency for which the bond special revenue fund was established for the purposes authorized by law for expenditures from such bond special 11 12 revenue fund. As used in this section, "bond special revenue fund" means 13 any special revenue fund or account thereof established in the state treasury prior to or on or after the effective date of this act for the deposit 14 15 of the proceeds of bonds issued by the Kansas development finance 16 authority for the payment of debt service for bonds issued by the Kansas 17 development finance authority or for any related purpose in accordance 18 with applicable bond covenants.

(a) During the fiscal year ending June 30, 20 2025, each federal grant or other federal receipt that is received by a state 21 agency named in this act and that is not otherwise appropriated to that state 22 agency for fiscal year 2025 by this or other appropriation act of the 2024 23 regular session of the legislature is hereby appropriated for fiscal year 24 2025 for that state agency for the purpose set forth in such federal grant or 25 receipt, except that no expenditure shall be made from and no obligation 26 shall be incurred against any such federal grant or other federal receipt that 27 has not been previously appropriated or reappropriated or approved for 28 expenditure by the governor until the governor has authorized the state 29 agency to make expenditures therefrom.

Sec. 168. (a) Any Kansas educational building fund appropriation heretofore appropriated to any institution named in this or other appropriation act of the 2024 regular session of the legislature and having an unencumbered balance as of June 30, 2024, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, for the same use and purpose as originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made for lapsing such appropriation.

(b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in
any account of the Kansas educational building fund that was encumbered
for any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2023.

Sec. 169. (a) Any state institutions building fund appropriation heretofore appropriated to any state agency named in this or other appropriation act of the 2024 regular session of the legislature and having an unencumbered balance as of June 30, 2024, in excess of \$100 is hereby reappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, for the same use and purpose as originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made for lapsing such appropriation.

(b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in
any account of the state institutions building fund that was encumbered for
any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2023.

Sec. 170. Any transfers of moneys during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, from any special revenue fund of any state agency named in this act to the audit services fund of the division of post audit under K.S.A. 46-1121, and amendments thereto, shall be in addition to any expenditure limitation imposed on any such fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025.

Sec. 171. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the Kansas register.
