 AN ACT concerning elections; relating to filings of declarations of intention to become a candidate, nomination petitions or certificates of nomination; requiring such filings for national, state, county, township and municipal office include the candidate's non-government issued email address; amending K.S.A. 25-205, 25-209, 25-304, 25-311, 25-2020 and 25-21a03 and K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 25-1903 and repealing the existing sections.

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9 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

10 Section 1. K.S.A. 25-205 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-11 205. (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the names name of 12 eandidates a candidate for national, state, county and township offices 13 shall be printed upon the official primary ballot when each shall have if 14 such candidate has qualified to become a candidate by one of the 15 following methods and none other: (1) They shall have had filed in their 16 behalf, Not later than 12 noon, June 1, prior to such primary election, or if 17 such date falls on Saturday, Sunday or a holiday, then before 12 noon of 18 the next following day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or a holiday, the 19 candidate shall.

20 (1) have had filed in their behalf nomination petitions, as provided for 21 in this act by law; or

(2) they shall have filed not later than the time for filing nomination
petitions, as above provided, with the proper officer a declaration of
intention to become a candidate, accompanied by the fee required by law.
Such declaration shall be prescribed by the secretary of state *and shall include the candidate's non-government issued email address*.

27 (b) Nomination petitions shall be in substantially the following form: I, the undersigned, an elector of the county of , and 28 state of Kansas, and a duly registered voter, and a member of 29 _____ party, hereby nominate _____, who resides in 30 the township of _____ (or at number 31 on _____ street, city of _____), in the county of 32 33 and state of Kansas, whose non-government issued *email address is* _____, as a candidate for the office of (here specify the office) ______, to be voted for at the primary 34 35 election to be held on the first Tuesday in August in _____, as 36

representing the principles of such party; and I further declare that I intend
 to support the candidate herein named and that I have not signed and will
 not sign any nomination petition for any other person, for such office at
 such primary election.

All nomination petitions shall have substantially the foregoing form, written or printed at the top-thereof of the petition. No signature shall be counted unless it is upon a sheet having such written or printed form-at the top thereof.

13 (c) Each signer of a nomination petition shall sign-but only one such petition for the same office, and. The signer shall declare that-such person 14 15 the signer intends to support the candidate-therein named in the 16 nomination petition, and shall add to-such person's the signature-and-17 residence, if in a city, by street and number (if any); or, otherwise by post-18 office the signer's residential address and the date of signing. No signature shall be counted unless the place of residence of the signer-is and date of 19 20 signing are clearly indicated and the date of signing given as herein-21 required and. If ditto marks are used to indicate *the* address they shall be 22 continuous and clearly made. Such sheets shall not be cut or pasted 23 together.

24 (d) All signers of each separate nomination petition shall reside in the 25 same county and election district of the office sought. The-affidavit-26 described in this paragraph of a petition circulator as defined in K.S.A. 25-27 3608, and amendments thereto, or-of the candidate shall-be appended 28 append an affidavit to each petition and shall contain, at the end of each 29 set of documents carried by-each the circulator,. The affidavit shall contain 30 a verification, signed by the circulator or-the candidate, to the effect that 31 such circulator or the candidate personally witnessed the signing of the petition by each person whose name appears thereon on the petition. 32

(e) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (g), nomination
petitions shall be signed *based on area of the electorate as follows. If for a*:

(1) If for a stateState officer elected on a statewide basis or for the
office of United States senator, by voters equal in number to not less than
1% of the total of the current voter registration of the party designated in
the state as compiled by the office of the secretary of state;

(2) if for a state or national officer elected on less than a statewide basis, by voters equal in number to not less than 2% of the total of the current voter registration of the party designated in such district as compiled by the office of the secretary of state, except that for the office of district magistrate judge, by not less than 2% of the total of the current voter registration of the party designated in the county in which such office
 is to be filled as certified to the secretary of state in accordance with
 K.S.A. 25-3302, and amendments thereto;

4 (3) if for a county office, by voters equal in number to not less than 5 3% of the total of the current voter registration of the party designated in 6 such district or county as compiled by the county election officer and 7 certified to the secretary of state in accordance with K.S.A. 25-3302, and 8 amendments thereto; and

9 (4) if for a township office, by voters equal in number to not less than 10 3% of the total of the current voter registration of the party designated in 11 such township as compiled by the county election officer and certified to 12 the secretary of state in accordance with K.S.A. 25-3302, and amendments 13 thereto.

(f) Subject to the requirements of K.S.A. 25-202, and amendments thereto, any political organization filing nomination petitions for a majority of the state or county offices, as provided in this act, shall have a separate primary election ballot as a political party and, upon receipt of such nomination petitions, the respective officers shall prepare a separate state and county ballot for such new party in their respective counties or districts thereof in the same manner as is provided for existing parties.

(g) In any year in which districts are reapportioned for the offices of
 representative in the United States congress, senator and representative in
 the legislature of the state of Kansas or member of the state board of
 education:

(1) if and the date that new boundary lines are defined and districts
 established in the manner prescribed by law on is:

(1) On or before May 10, *then* nomination petitions for nomination to
such offices shall be signed by voters equal in number to not less than 1%
of the total of the current voter registration of the party designated in the
district as compiled by the office of the secretary of state.: or

(2) If new boundary lines are defined and districts established in the
manner prescribed by law on or after May-11 10, then nomination petitions
for nomination to the following offices shall be signed by registered voters
of the party designated in the district equal in number to not less than the
following:

36 (A) For the office of representative in the United States congress
37 1,000 registered voters;

(B) for the office of member of the state board of education 300registered voters;

40 41 (C) for the office of state senator 75 registered voters; and

(D) for the office of state representative 25 registered voters.

42 (h) In any year in which districts are reapportioned for the offices of 43 representative in the United States congress, senator and representative in the legislature of the state of Kansas or member of the state board of
 education:

3 (1)—If and if the date that new boundary lines are defined and districts
 4 are established in the manner prescribed by law-on is:

5 (1) On or before May 10, *then* the deadline for filing nomination 6 petitions and declarations of intention to become a candidate for such 7 office, accompanied by the fee required by law, shall be 12 noon on June 8 1, or if such date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or a holiday, then before 12 9 noon of the next following day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or holiday.; 10 *or*

11 (2) If new boundary lines are defined and districts established in the 12 manner preseribed by law on or after May-11 10, then the deadline for 13 filing nomination petitions and declarations of intention to become a 14 candidate for such office, accompanied by the fee required by law, shall be 15 12 noon on June 10, or if such date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, 16 then before 12 noon of the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or 17 holiday.

(i) Primary elections for candidates for municipal office shall be held
 when otherwise required by law. The names of candidates for municipal
 offices shall be printed upon the official primary ballot in odd-numbered
 year elections and in even-numbered years when needed. Persons shall
 become qualified to become a candidate by one of the following methods:

(1) They shall have filed. Not later than 12 noon, on June 1, prior to
such primary election, or if such date falls on Saturday, Sunday or a
holiday, then before 12 noon of the next following day that is not a
Saturday, Sunday or a holiday, *the candidate shall*:

(1) Have had filed nomination petitions, as otherwise provided by
law. The person's non-government issued email address shall be provided
with such filing; or

(2) they shall-have filed, not later than the time for filing nomination
petitions, as above provided, with the proper officer a declaration of
intention to become a candidate, accompanied by the \$20 fee required by
law. Such declaration shall be prescribed by the secretary of state as
provided in K.S.A. 25-21a03, and amendments thereto, and shall include
the person's non-government issued email address.

36 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 25-209 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-209. 37 (a) As soon as possible after the filing deadline, the secretary of state shall 38 certify to each county election officer the name-and, post-office address 39 and non-government issued email address of each person who has filed 40 valid nomination petitions or a declaration of intent to become a candidate for United States senator or representative or for state office, together with 41 42 the designation of the office for which each is a candidate and the party or 43 principle which the candidate represents.

1 (b) The county election officer shall, upon receipt thereof, publish for 2 three consecutive weeks in the official paper, a notice-which that shall set 3 forth under the proper party designation, the title of each national, state, 4 county and township office any part of the district of which is in the 5 county, the names-and, addresses and non-government issued email 6 addresses of all persons certified by the secretary of state as candidates for 7 any national or state office any part of the district of which is in the county 8 and, in addition thereto, the names-and, addresses and non-government 9 issued email addresses of all persons from whom valid nomination papers 10 or declarations have been filed in the county election officer's office,giving the name and address of each, The notice shall also set forth the 11 12 day of the primary election, the hours during which the polls will be open and stating state that the primary election will be held at the regular voting 13 places. Where such voting places are not well established and customarily 14 known the published notice herein provided for shall give the location of 15 16 such voting places.

17 (c) The secretary of state and county election officers shall utilize the 18 procedures established in this section to the extent applicable for 19 municipal elections conducted in the fall of both odd-numbered and even-20 numbered years when needed.

21 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 25-304 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-304. 22 All certificates of nomination shall be in writing, shall contain the name of 23 each person nominated, with such person's residence, non-government 24 issued email address and the office for which nominated. Party certificates 25 of nomination shall designate the political party which the convention, primary election or caucus making the nominations represented. When 26 27 electors for president and vice-president of the United States are 28 nominated, the names of the candidates for president and vice-president 29 may also be shown on the certificates. Independent nomination petitions 30 for presidential electors shall contain the names of each elector and the 31 names of the candidates for president and vice-president of the United 32 States, together with the residence of each elector and candidate and each 33 candidate's non-government issued email address. The provisions of this 34 section shall not apply to city or school elections, nor to the election of 35 officers for which it is provided by law to be elected at the time of city and 36 school elections.

Sec. 4. K.S.A. 25-311 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-311. Not less than twenty-(20) days before an election to fill any national or state office, the secretary of state shall certify to the county election officer of each county within which any of the electors may by law vote for the candidates for such office, the name-and, *non-government issued email address and* residence of each person nominated for such office, as specified in the certificates of nomination or nomination papers filed with 1 the secretary of state.

2 Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 25-1903 is hereby amended to read as 3 follows: 25-1903. (a) A person may become a candidate for election to the 4 office of state board member by either one of the methods provided in this 5 section.

6 (1) Any person who is an elector of any board member district may 7 petition to be a candidate for member of the state board from the board 8 member district in which such person resides. Any such person shall file 9 with the secretary of state a petition for the candidacy of such person 10 signed by not less than 200 electors residing in such board member 11 district.

12 (2) Any person who is an elector of any board member district may 13 become a candidate for member of the state board from the board member 14 district in which such candidate resides by filing in the office of the 15 secretary of state a declaration of intent to be such a candidate and 16 payment of a filing fee in the amount of \$25.

17 (b) Any such petition or declaration of intention filed by a candidate 18 to run in the primary election held in accordance with K.S.A. 25-203, and 19 amendments thereto, shall be filed no later than 12:00 noon, June 1, prior 20 to such primary election, or if such date falls on Saturday, Sunday or a 21 holiday, then before 12:00 noon of the next following day that is not a 22 Saturday, Sunday or a holiday. Any such petition or declaration of 23 intention filed by an independent candidate for the office of state board 24 member shall be filed no later than 12:00 noon on the Monday preceding 25 the date fixed for the holding of primary elections in accordance with 26 K.S.A. 25-203, and amendments thereto. All filings of such petitions or 27 declarations of intention by candidates or independent candidates shall 28 include the candidate's or independent candidate's non-government issued 29 email address.

Sec. 6. K.S.A. 25-2020 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-2020. (a) When a district method of election is in effect in any school district, a person may become a candidate for election to board member by any one of the following methods:

(1) Any person who is an elector in any member district may petition
to be a candidate for board member from the member district in which
such person resides. Any such person shall file with the county election
officer, a petition for such candidacy signed by not less than 50 electors
residing in such member district or by a number of such electors equal to
not less than 10% of the electors residing in such member district,
whichever is less.

41 (2) Any person who is an elector in any school district may petition to
42 be a candidate for board member at-large from the school district in which
43 such person resides. Any such person shall file with the county election

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officer, a petition for such candidacy signed by not less than 50 electors
 residing in such school district.

3 (3) Any person who is an elector in any member district may become 4 a candidate for board member from the member district in which such 5 person resides by filing with the county election officer a declaration of 6 intention to become such a candidate, and <u>payment therewith of *paying*</u> a 7 filing fee in the amount of \$20. Such declaration shall be prescribed by the 8 secretary of state.

9 (4) Any person who is an elector in any school district may become a 10 candidate for board member at-large from the school district in which such 11 person resides by filing with the county election officer a declaration of 12 intention to become such a candidate, and payment therewith of *paying* a 13 filing fee in the amount of \$20. Such declaration shall be prescribed by the 14 secretary of state.

15 (5) Any such petition or declaration shall specify the member position 16 for which the person is a candidate *and shall include the person's non-*17 *government issued email address.*

(b) When the election at large method is in effect in any school
district, a person may become a candidate for election to board member by
either one of the following methods:

(1) Any person who is an elector of the school district may petition to
 be a candidate for board member. Any such person shall file with the
 county election officer a petition for such candidacy signed by not less
 than 50 electors residing in the school district.

(2) Any person who is an elector in the unified school district may
become a candidate for board member by filing with the county election
officer a declaration of intention to become such a candidate, and payment
therewith of a filing fee in the amount of \$20. Such declaration shall be
prescribed by the secretary of state.

30 (3) Any such petition or declaration which is for an unexpired term of 31 a member shall so specify.

(c) Any such petition or declaration of intent must be filed before the
filing deadline as prescribed in K.S.A. 25-205, and amendments thereto.
No candidate shall be permitted to withdraw from candidacy after the
filing deadline.

36 (d) Within three days from the date of the filing of a nomination
37 petition or a declaration of intention to become a candidate for board
38 member, the county election officer shall determine the validity of such
39 petition or declaration.

40 (e) Any such petition or declaration of intent shall include the 41 candidate's non-government issued email address.

42 *(f)* If a nomination petition or declaration is found to be invalid, the 43 county election officer shall notify the candidate on whose behalf the 1 petition or declaration was filed that such nomination petition or 2 declaration has been found to be invalid and the reason for the finding. 3 Such candidate may make objection to the finding of invalidity by the 4 county election officer in accordance with K.S.A. 25-308, and 5 amendments thereto.

6 Sec. 7. K.S.A. 25-21a03 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-7 21a03. (a) The secretary of state shall develop the style and form of the 8 official primary ballot and the official general election ballot for municipal 9 offices.

10 (b) The declaration of intent to become a candidate shall be 11 prescribed by the secretary of state *and shall include the candidate's non-*12 *government issued email address*. The declarations for any municipality 13 shall be filed with the county election officer not later than 12 noon, June 14 1, prior to the primary election in both even-numbered and odd-numbered 15 years, or if such date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, then before 12 16 noon of the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or holiday.

(c) The secretary of state shall establish primary election proceduresfor primary elections for municipalities.

(d) The secretary of state shall establish general election proceduresfor general elections for municipalities.

(e) County election officers shall conduct municipal elections in odd numbered years and elections in even-numbered years if needed.

(f) The secretary of state shall adopt rules and regulations toimplement this section on or before July 1, 2016.

25 Sec. 8. K.S.A. 25-205, 25-209, 25-304, 25-311, 25-2020 and 25-26 21a03 and K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 25-1903 are hereby repealed.

27 Sec. 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 28 publication in the statute book.
