SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2706

As Amended by House Committee on Transportation

Brief*

HB 2706, as amended, would permit model year license plates with decals issued during calendar year 1975 or later to be displayed on antique trucks and motorcycles.

The bill would also permit antique vehicle license plates to be restored or repainted with the same color scheme with which the model year license plate was originally issued, provided the plate remains legible and serviceable.

The bill would also make technical amendments.

Background

The bill was introduced by the House Committee on Transportation at the request of Representative Houser.

House Committee on Transportation

In the House Committee hearing, **proponent** testimony was provided by Representative Houser and a private citizen. The proponents generally stated the bill would resolve problems caused by changes in issuance of license plates and decals enacted in 1974 and implemented in 1975 and 1976. They noted continuing law permits display of license plates and year decals from 1976 and later on antique

passenger vehicles but issuance differed for trucks and motorcycles.

No other testimony was provided.

The House Committee amended the bill to add the provision permitting antique vehicle license plates to be restored or repainted.

Fiscal Information

According to the fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget on the bill, as introduced, the Department of Revenue estimates enactment of the bill would require additional expenditures of \$2,090 in FY 2025 for administrative costs. Any fiscal effect associated with enactment of the bill is not reflected in *The FY 2025 Governor's Budget Report*.
