# **Agency Request**

The **agency** requests \$1.7 million, all from the Administrative Hearings Office Fund, in expenditures and 14.0 FTE positions for FY 2024. This is an increase of \$14,793, or 0.9 percent, above the FY 2023 revised estimate. This is primarily attributable to the agency's enhancement request for \$32,915 to implement a 5.0 percent salary increase for Administrative Law Judges (ALJs). The agency notes that ALJs earn a starting salary of \$85,000. According to the agency, this is significantly less than comparable state employees, including state agency chief and general counsels. Therefore, the agency argues that compensation increases are necessary to recruit and retain qualified ALJs and other staff. The agency has indicated that the compensation gap hinders the ability to recruit and retain qualified employees. The agency's proposed compensation increases will enable recruitment and retention of highly qualified ALJs, and continue to conduct efficient, fair, and impartial hearings.

### **Governor's Recommendation**

The **Governor** recommends expenditures of \$1.7 million, all from the Administrative Office Hearings Fund, and 14.0 FTE positions for FY 2024. This is a decrease of \$32,915, or 1.1 percent, below the agency request for FY 2024. The decrease is due to the Governor not recommending the agency's enhancement request for a salary increase for ALJs for FY 2024.

### **Senate Subcommittee Recommendation**

The **Subcommittee** concurs with the Governor's recommendation for FY 2024.

## **Senate Committee Recommendation**

The **Committee** concurs with the Subcommittee's recommendation for FY 2024 with the following recommendation:

## **Agency Request**

The **agency** requests \$1.7 million, all from the Administrative Hearings Office Fund, in expenditures and 14.0 FTE positions for FY 2024. This is an increase of \$14,793, or 0.9 percent, above the FY 2023 revised estimate. This is primarily attributable to the agency's enhancement request for \$32,915 to implement a 5.0 percent salary increase for Administrative Law Judges (ALJs). The agency notes that ALJs earn a starting salary of \$85,000. According to the agency, this is significantly less than comparable state employees, including state agency chief and general counsels. Therefore, the agency argues that compensation increases are necessary to recruit and retain qualified ALJs and other staff. The agency has indicated that the compensation gap hinders the ability to recruit and retain qualified employees. The agency's proposed compensation increases will enable recruitment and retention of highly qualified ALJs, and continue to conduct efficient, fair, and impartial hearings.

### **Governor's Recommendation**

The **Governor** recommends expenditures of \$1.7 million, all from the Administrative Office Hearings Fund, and 14.0 FTE positions for FY 2024. This is a decrease of \$32,915, or 1.1 percent, below the agency request for FY 2024. The decrease is due to the Governor not recommending the agency's enhancement request for a salary increase for ALJs for FY 2024.

## **House Budget Committee Recommendation**

The **Budget Committee** concurs with the Governor's recommendation for FY 2024 with the following adjustments:

- Add \$138,523, all from the Administrative Hearings Office Fund, for the first year of a two-year pay scale adjustment for Administrative Law Judges in the Office of Administrative Hearings to achieve pay parity with Administrative Law Judges in the Department of Labor for FY 2024.
- Add \$138,522, all from the Administrative Hearings Office Fund, for the second year
  of a two-year pay scale adjustment for Administrative Law Judges in the Office of
  Administrative Hearings to achieve pay parity with Administrative Law Judges in the
  Department of Labor for FY 2025.

## **House Committee Recommendation**
