## 2023 Kansas Statutes

- **50-6,139. Identity theft; identity fraud; unconscionable act or practice; Wayne Owen act.** (a) The conduct prohibited by K.S.A. 21-6107, and amendments thereto, constitutes an unconscionable act or practice in violation of K.S.A. 50-627, and amendments thereto, and any person who engages in such conduct shall be subject to the remedies and penalties provided by the Kansas consumer protection act.
- (b) For the purposes of the remedies and penalties provided by the Kansas consumer protection act:
- (1) The person committing the conduct prohibited by K.S.A. 21-6107, and amendments thereto, shall be deemed the supplier, and the person who is the victim of such conduct shall be deemed the consumer; and
- (2) proof of a consumer transaction shall not be required.
- (c) This section shall be part of and supplemental to the Kansas consumer protection act.
- (d) The provisions of this section and K.S.A. 50-6,139a and 50-6,139b, and amendments thereto, shall be known and may be cited as the Wayne Owen act. **History:** L. 2013, ch. 123, § 6; L. 2016, ch. 103, § 3; July 1.
