History of KPERS Service Purchases**

<u>Date Effective</u>	<u>Type of Service Purchase</u>
July 1, 1971	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Year of service. ▪ Forfeited service. ▪ Former KSRS members with forfeited KSRS service prior to January 1, 1971.
July 1, 1972	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The period between the employer's entry date and becoming a member for employment prior to the employer's entry date, following year of service.
July 1, 1974	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Up to 6 years of military service.
July 1, 1975	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Military service via lump-sum payment.
July 1, 1979	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Forfeited KSRS service.
July 1, 1980	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Elected official service.
July 1, 1983	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Qualifying service for employees 70 and older.
July 1, 1984	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Partial year of service from employer's entry date to date of membership. ▪ Forfeited KP&F or Judges service.
July 1, 1985	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Eligible employees must elect to start purchase of military service by January 1, 1986. Future employees must elect to start purchase of military service within four years of becoming a member.
July 1, 1987	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Forfeited service or elected official service at an additional rate of contribution equal to either 8% or 12% of the member's compensation.
January 1, 1988	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Elected official service by making a lump-sum payment in the amount of 4% of the member's compensation

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| July 1, 1988 | ▪ Year of service at additional rate of contribution equal to either 8% or 12% of the member's compensation. |
| July 1, 1989 | ▪ Purchase of military service must be completed five years prior to retirement. |
| July 1, 1990 | ▪ Employee purchasing forfeited service by making a lump-sum payment must pay the actuarially determined cost. Employers are prohibited from paying this cost. |
| July 1, 1993 | ▪ Year of service via lump-sum payment in an amount equal to the required employee contribution rate.
▪ Year of service, forfeited service, military service, or service as an elected official at additional rate of contribution at a rate of either two times or three times the employee's contribution. |
| July 1, 1994 | ▪ Military service via lump-sum payment at the actuarially determined cost. |
| July 1, 1995 | ▪ Year of service via lump-sum payment must pay the actuarially determined cost.
▪ Forfeited Wichita employees retirement plan service via lump-sum payment at the actuarially determined cost. Or, starting in 1996, at an additional rate of contribution.
▪ Forfeited TIAA-CREF service via lump-sum payment at the actuarially determined cost, or at an additional rate of contribution.
▪ Out-of-state non-federal service via lump-sum payment at the actuarially determined cost.
▪ Local police and fire pension service via lump-sum payment at the actuarially determined cost, or at an additional rate of contribution. |
| July 1, 1996 | ▪ Out-of-state non-federal service if meets requirements of an employee as defined in K.S.A. 74-4902. |

- United States Peace Corps service.
 - Emporia State University Memorial Union service.
- July 1, 1998
- Year of service within 12 months of membership, cost of lump-sum payment is 4% of the member's compensation.
 - Employer may pay lump-sum cost for employee's purchase of forfeited service.
 - Out-of-state service, peace corps service, or memorial union service will result in a benefit equal to either 1% or 1.75% of the member's final average salary. Members who previously elected 1% may now purchase an additional .75%.
 - State non-federal employment service.
- July 1, 2000
- VISTA service.
- July 1, 2007
- Law enforcement personnel in support of United Nations mission service.
- July 1, 2009
- Up to 2 years of journeyman experience for day trade, personal service and public service teachers.
