Chairman Taddiken opened the hearing on <u>SB 272–Water rights; multi-year flex accounts;</u> application for division of water right; fee.

David Wiese, Office of the Revisor of Statutes, said that <u>SB 272</u> would amend existing law in the Kansas Water Appropriations Act that authorizes and governs multi-year flex accounts.

David Barfield, Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources, Kansas Department of Agriculture, (KDA) appeared in support of <u>SB 272</u>. (Attachment 1) He said the bill would increase the amount of groundwater that can be pumped under a flex account, without increasing overall water use. He also said the bill provides three different potential options for water users to compute the amount of water that they can place into a flex account. Mr. Barfield testified that this statute is drafted so that it can be implemented as quickly as possible. He noted that the multi-flex year accounts would be voluntary. Mr. Barfield took questions from the Committee.

Mike Beam, Kansas Livestock Association, testified in support of <u>SB 272</u> (Attachment 2) and suggested that the effective date would be upon publication in the *Kansas Register* rather than the Statutes. Mr. Beam offered to take questions.

Kent Askren, Assistant Director, Kansas Farm Bureau, spoke in support of <u>SB 272</u> (<u>Attachment 3</u>). Mr. Askren stated that the 2 year drought emergency term permit initiated by the KDA was a good stopgap effort but a more long term carefully planned water management strategy is needed for the future.

Mr. Barfield took further questions.

Gary Harshberger, Chairman, Kansas Water Authority, offered testimony in favor of <u>SB 272</u>. (<u>Attachment 4</u>) He said that the proposed changes to the multi-year flex account program provides increased flexibility for farmers to manage crop water over a five year period. He also said this bill is born of necessity and opportunity. Mr. Harshberger said that the Kansas Water Authority is trying to change from a culture of consumption to a culture of conservation. He further stated that to do nothing will cause a crisis next year. Mr. Harshberger took questions from the Committee.
