AN ACT concerning crimes and punishment; relating to identity theft; 1 2 amending Section 177 of chapter 136 of the 2010 Session Laws of 3 Kansas and repealing the existing section. 4 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 6 Section 1. Section 177 of chapter 136 of the 2010 Session Laws of 7 Kansas is hereby amended to read as follows: Sec. 177. (a) Identity 8 theft is obtaining, possessing, transferring, using, selling or purchasing 9 any personal identifying information, or document containing the same, belonging to or issued to another person, with the intent to defraud that 10 person, or anyone else, in order to receive any benefit. 11 (b) Identity fraud is: 12 13 (1) Using or supplying information the person knows to be false in 14 order to obtain a document containing any personal identifying 15 information; or (2) altering, amending, counterfeiting, making, manufacturing or 16 17 otherwise replicating any document containing personal identifying information with the intent to deceive: 18 19 (c) (1) Identity theft is a: (A) Severity level 8 9, nonperson person felony, except as 20 21 provided in subsection (c)(1)(B); and 22 (B) is a severity level 5, nonperson person felony if the monetary 23 loss to the victim or victims is more than \$100,000. 24 (2) Identity fraud is a severity level **8**9, nonperson person felony. 25 (d) It is not a defense that the person did not know that such personal identifying information belongs to another person, or that the 26 27 person to whom such personal identifying information belongs or was 28 issued is deceased. 29 (e) As used in this section, "personal identifying information" 30 includes, but is not limited to, the following: 31 (1) Name; 32 (2) birth date; 33 (3) address;

2 (5) driver's license number or card or nondriver's identification 3 number or card;

(6) social security number or card;

(7) place of employment;

6 (8) employee identification numbers or other personal 7 identification numbers or cards;

8 (9) mother's maiden name;

9 (10) birth, death or marriage certificates;

10 (11) electronic identification numbers;

11 (12) electronic signatures; and

12 (13) any financial number, or password that can be used to access

13 a person's financial resources, including, but not limited to, checking or 14 savings accounts, credit or debit card information, demand deposit or

15 medical information.

Sec. 2. Section 177 of chapter 136 of the 2010 Session Laws ofKansas is hereby repealed.

18 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its19 publication in the statute book.
