HB 2603 - designating part of U.S. 169 Highway as the Robert V. Talkington highway

Chairman Hayzlett opened hearings on **HB 2603** and called on Representative Dreher to present testimony in support of this bill.

Representative Dreher stated Senator Talkington was the driving force in getting New US 169 constructed and was most deserving of the honor of having the highway named for him. (Attachment 1)

There being no other proponents, or opponents, Chairman Hayzlett closed hearings on **HB 2603**.

Following discussion Chairman Hayzlett presented **HB 2603** for final action. Representative Beggs made a motion to pass **HB 2603** favorably, seconded by Representative Osborne and the motion carried.

Representative McKinney made a motion to introduce a bill which would extend the compression reduction brake system ordinance one-half mile beyond the city limits, seconded by Representative Ballou and the motion carried.
