2012 Kansas Statutes

- **23-36,613.** Jurisdiction to modify child support order of another state when individual parties reside in this state. (a) If all of the parties who are individuals reside in this state and the child does not reside in the issuing state, a tribunal of this state has jurisdiction to enforce and to modify the issuing state's child support order in a proceeding to register that order.
- (b) A tribunal of this state exercising jurisdiction under this section shall apply the provisions of K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 23-3102, 23-3103, 23-36,101, 23-36,102, 23-36,103, 23-36,201 through 23-36,601 through 23-36,611, and amendments thereto, and the procedural and substantive law of this state to the proceeding for enforcement or modification. K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 23-36,301 et seq., 23-36,401, 23-36,501, 23-36,502, 23-36,701 and 23-36,801, 23-36,802, and amendments thereto, do not apply.
