Mary Jane Stankiewicz, Chief Operating Officer and Senior Vice President, Kansas Agribusiness Retailers Association, requested the introduction of a bill regarding adding a definition of sustainability in the statutes. Entity Description

KSA 74-560 *et seq.* created the position of Secretary of Agriculture. The Secretary is appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation by the Senate as provided in K.S.A 75-4315b.

The Secretary must have a demonstrated executive and administrative ability to discharge the duties of the office of Secretary. The Secretary is a member of the Governor's Cabinet and serves at the pleasure of the Governor. The Secretary is in the unclassified service under the Kansas Civil Service Act and receives an annual salary fixed by the Governor.

The Secretary organizes an annual public informational meeting. The meeting takes place in each congressional district on a rotating basis.

The provisions of the Kansas Governmental Operations Accountability Law apply to the Kansas Department of Agriculture, and the Department is subject to audit, review and evaluation under the law.

Budget Information

The Department of Agriculture had approved FY 2008 operating expenditures of nearly \$26.0 million, including \$12.0 million from the State General Fund and 338.5 full-time equivalent (FTE) positions approved. FY 2008 saw the transfer of the Food Service Inspection Program, with 38.0 FTE, from the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. The FY 2009 appropriation was \$28,019,468; FY 2010, \$27,673,238.

Department of Agriculture - Secretary

Powers and Duties

The Department of Agriculture is administered under the direction and supervision of the Secretary of Agriculture.

The Secretary has the power to:

- Oversee the enforcement or administration of the:
 - Food Service and Lodging Act and the Food Safety Act;
 - Commercial Feedings Stuffs Law;
 - Labeling and testing requirements of the Seed Law;
 - Kansas Egg Law;
 - Laws and procedures of the Grain Commodity Commissions;
 - Grain Warehouse Law; and
 - The Meat and Poultry Inspection Act.

- Implement the:
 - Kansas Dairy Law;
 - Agricultural Chemicals Act, including chemical registration requirements;
 - Agricultural Liming Act, including labeling, inspection and manufacturing requirements;
 - Chemigation Safety Law, including registration requirements;
 - Fertilizer Law, including licensing requirements;
 - Pesticide Law, including licensing requirements for businesses and government agencies;
 - Soil Amendment Act, including labeling, inspection and registration requirements; and
 - Petroleum Products Inspection Law.

- Administer:
 - Nutrient Utilization Plans;
 - Functions relating to labeling agricultural products; and
 - Functions relating to the Wine Advisory Council.

- Enter into the Interstate Dairy Compact on behalf of the state;

- Review the orders and conduct of the Chief Engineer of the Division of Water Resources to ensure compliance with the Water Appropriations Act and review rules and regulations of the Chief Engineer prior to promulgation;

- Promote economic development of agriculture in the state; and

- Enter into contracts, promulgate rules and regulations, impose penalties and collect authorized fees when implementing various programs under the jurisdiction of the Secretary or the Department of Agriculture.

- Helped negotiate the dissolution of the 30+ year farm partnership, Svaty Brothers, between my Dad and his two brothers. Unlike many family farm partnerships that eventually split up, it was amicable.
- Manage the relationships to our landlords, staying in contact and encouraging new possibilities for growth. I am also part of every decision on machinery acquisition and am in control of land acquisition.
- Worked my entire life in every aspect of the farm, with intimate knowledge of our crop production, cattle herd, sheep herd, the history of the hog herd, and our truck garden operation.

In Politics:

- Elected to the Kansas House at the age of 22, beating an incumbent with a margin of 66% to 34%
- Managed all of my subsequent campaigns, including budgets and fundraising. I also wrote all copy for all published materials and media.
- In three contested elections and one unopposed race I have never fallen below 58% of the vote in any election, most recently garnering 63%, and my district is 51% Republican, 25% Independent, and 23% Democrat.

- Named the Ranking Minority Member of the House Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee, 2005 – Present.
- Attended five Kansas Geological Survey Tours, which are intense three day sessions generally dealing with water issues and land use. This year's focused on Southwest Kansas and IGUCAs.

The Svaty Farm

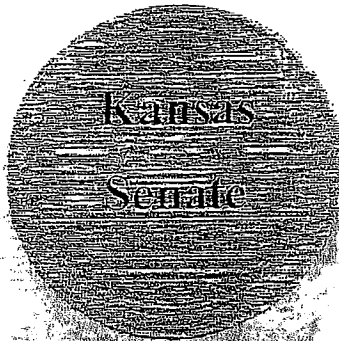
I have been a part of the farm my entire life, but the Svaty Brothers partnership was dissolved because my generation was now old enough to begin taking an ownership role in the farm and each family needed an avenue to make that happen. This occurred in January of 2009, and I have begun the process of assuming an ownership role in the portion of the operation that became my father's. In the meantime, I have been a part of the decision making since I returned home from college. Svaty Brothers consisted of around 5,500 acres of ground, including broken ground, pasture, and CRP. Our portion of the farm is now around 2,400 acres, split evenly between broken ground, pasture, and CRP.

Other work experience

2001-2004 I worked the seasonal harvest shift at the Ellsworth County Farmer's Cooperative for several summers. I managed the dock, which included sampling and testing the wheat. I also gained a strong working knowledge of a typical Kansas grain elevator, from fixing the leg to loading out grain carts for rail.

2003-2004 I worked part-time during the summers as a ropes-course instructor for the St. Francis Academy in Salina. My tasks included facilitating both high and low ropes activities both for the level 5 CINC (Child in Need of Care) and Level 6 residents of St. Francis Academy (Level 6 is the highest level of care – these residents are in the most restricted environment before Juvenile Detention) and for the many private groups that would contract to use the ropes facility.

2001 –Present I serve as a lay minister for area churches. I began by filling the pulpit for the entire year at Arlington Presbyterian Church in Arlington, Kansas during my senior year at Sterling College. When I returned home for the legislature I continued preaching at churches on an as-needed basis. I served the Carneiro and Kanopolis Methodist Churches for the entire summer of 2004. I have also preached at Brookville Methodist, First Presbyterian Church of Beloit, Sylvan Grove Presbyterian Church, and Assaria Lutheran Church, among others. I have conducted two funerals.



Response to Question No. 4:

I was honored when the Governor asked if I would be interested in serving the remainder of outgoing Secretary Polansky's term. The Department of Agriculture is twofold – it is a strong regulatory agency, and it is also an important promotional agency. I have worked closely with the department since I joined the legislature, but certainly since I have been the Ranking Member of the House Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee. Because of my farm experience, I have a strong working knowledge of the regulatory elements of the Department of Agriculture from both perspectives. Because I worked with the department so much, I knew most of the program managers and their areas prior to being named Acting Secretary. This is an abbreviated time frame (probably 18 months), and I feel I am uniquely suited to step in and finish the good job Secretary Polansky had been doing. The position needed someone that could hit the ground running.

I also feel that I am well suited for the promotion of agriculture. I have spoken statewide and across the country on everything ranging from leadership to energy policy. I am very comfortable speaking before groups both on dedicated topics and informal remarks. I have a great deal of media experience and understand the importance of discretion.

Finally, much of the role of Secretary is managerial. The Department of Agriculture was left in excellent condition by Secretary Polansky, and his leadership team is entirely in place. This includes Deputy Secretary Constantine Cotsoradis, who was a critical part of employee management. I work very well with a wide variety of individuals, and already knew most of the members of the senior staff. In many ways the management of the staff is maintenance oriented, as the department functions very well. 

Rule 56. Confirmation of Appointments by Governor or Other State Official. All nominations or appointments made by the governor or other state official, which are subject to Senate confirmation, may be considered and acted upon by the Senate in either executive or regular session except that no final action thereon may be taken in executive session. When nominations or appointments are made by the governor or other state official for confirmation by the Senate, they shall, unless otherwise ordered by the President, be referred to appropriate committees by the President. Nominations or appointments referred to committees shall be returned to the Senate within 20 legislative days after the same are referred, together with a report thereon, unless additional time be granted by a majority vote of senators present. If the nomination or appointment is not returned to the Senate within the period of time specified for its return and additional time has not been granted, the nomination or appointment shall be considered to be returned to the Senate without recommendation on the next legislative day following the last day of the period of time specified for its return. Any such appointment may be considered and acted upon by the Senate at any time after the nomination or appointment is returned to the Senate. No motion to confirm any such appointment or nomination shall be in order without the unanimous consent of the Senate until the nomination or appointment is returned to the Senate, unless one day's previous notice thereof is given in open session. Appointments shall be confirmed by the Senate only by an affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the Senate then elected (or appointed) and qualified.

Rule 57. Admittance to Floor – Lobbying on Floor – Galleries. No person shall be admitted to the floor of the Senate except elective state officers; members of the Legislature; friends of the members of the Senate, upon invitation signed by the President and the Senator extending the invitation; former members of the Senate, officers and employees of the legislative branch, and members of the news media who are actually employed, and who have a card of admission from the President. The Senate by resolution, may issue such invitations as it desires. Persons so admitted must stay in the perimeter of the Senate chamber except with the express permission of a member of the Senate. No one registered with the Secretary of State as an agent or lobbyist may be on the floor of the Senate during the hours of 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. nor at the time the Senate is in session. No person, other than a state officer or employee of the legislative branch or legislator, shall discuss any measure with any Senator on the floor of the Senate during the time the Senate is in session. Any person who violates this rule or any person who shall gain admission to the floor of the Senate by false representation shall be forthwith ejected from the Senate chamber and thereafter be denied admission. No employee shall lobby for or against any
