POLLING MEMORANDUM



RE: Survey of likely voters statewide in Kansas

Wenzel Strategies conducted a telephone survey of registered voters statewide in Kansas regarding political and social issues. The survey was conducted Nov.29 - Dec.1 2012, and included 813 respondents. The survey was balanced for such demographic factors as age, gender, political affiliation, and regional distribution to represent the overall population of the state of Kansas. The survey carries a confidence interval of 95% and a margin of error of +/- 3.41 percentage points.

Q: Please tell me if you agree or disagree with this statement:

"If a doctor is able to detect the heartbeat of an unborn baby, that baby should be legally protected."







Wenzel Strategies surveyed Kansas voters regarding the issue of abortion and found that the overwhelming majority of respondents -63% – agreed that, if a heartbeat of an unborn baby can be detected, that baby should be legally protected. Another 30% disagreed with this statement, while 8% said they were unsure on the matter.

Strong majorities of both men and women agreed with this statement, as 63% of men and 62% of women said they agreed with this statement. And, the survey showed, most of those agreeing with this statement said that they "strongly agreed" with it. Overall, 50% said they strongly agreed with it.

On the other side of the issue, 16% said they strongly disagreed with this statement about protecting the life of an unborn baby if a heartbeat is detected, and 14% said they "somewhat disagreed" with it.

The survey also found that, should a lawmaker in the Kansas state legislature voted against their beliefs on the issue of abortion, 83% of respondents would oppose that lawmaker when they ran for re-election. While 51% said they would mildly oppose such a lawmaker over their abortion vote, 32% said their opposition would be more vigorous — with 12% saying they would "actively oppose" that lawmaker.


The issue of abortion is clearly one of those issues that animate Kansas voters, this polling data show. A significant plurality of Kansans said it was either the most important issue to them when deciding for which state and federal candidate to vote, or one of the top three issues. While 16% said it was the top issue for them when choosing a candidate for public office, another 31% said it was one of the top three issues. Thirty-eight percent said it was not that important, and 15% said it was not important at all.

Most Kansas voters said they believe abortions should be prevented at least part of the time. While 16% of voters statewide said they oppose all abortions, another 24% said they oppose abortion except in cases where the mother was a victim of a rape or incest. Another 10% said they opposed abortions except in cases where the life of the mother was at risk, and 21% said they are mostly pro-choice but that they oppose late-term abortions. Just 21% said they believe in abortion in all cases.


