Kansas Puppy Mills

A Disturbing Pattern of Animal Abuse & Lax Enforcment



This report reflects findings from several sources, including Kansas inspection reports, USDA inspection reports, the HSUS "Kansas's Dirty Dozen" report and the HSUS "A Horrible Hundred" report. Viewed together, they reveal a disturbing pattern of facilities with multiple and egregious violations continuing to operate in Kansas due to lax enforcement.




2008 Failed two state inspections in a row: sanitation, maintenance, and animal welfare






