SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for HB 2176 by Representative Barker, et al.
In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2176 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

HB 2176 would provide that, on and after January 1, 2014, any owner or lessee of one or more passenger vehicles, trucks registered for a gross weight of 20,000 pounds or less, or motorcycles may be issued one Eisenhower Foundation license plate for each vehicle upon payment of a royalty payment between $\$ 25$ and $\$ 100$. Certain other requirements that are consistent with other specialty plates are also specified in the bill.

The Department of Revenue estimates that the new Eisenhower Foundation plate created in HB 2176 would increase state revenues by $\$ 40,000$ in FY 2014. Of this amount, $\$ 20,000$ would be credited to the State Highway Fund from a provision in K.S.A 8-1,141, which subjects the plate to a minimum of 500 plates for the initial issuance and a $\$ 40$ personalized plate fee. The $\$ 40,000$ also includes $\$ 20,000$ which is required of the sponsoring organization and credited to the Distinctive License Plate Fund to help the Department of Revenue defray the costs associated with the development of the new plate.

The Department estimates the bill would increase its expenditures by $\$ 8,990$ from the Division of Vehicles Operating Fund in FY 2014 which include $\$ 2,640$ for 16 hours of
programming at $\$ 165$ per hour to modify the new vehicle system; $\$ 4,130$ for the initial order of 500 auto and truck plates at $\$ 8.26$ per plate; and $\$ 2,220$ for an initial order of 300 motorcycle plates at $\$ 7.40$ per plate. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2176 is not reflected in The FY 2014 Governor's Budget Report.
