SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 14 by Senator Hensley, et al.

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 14 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 14 would prohibit any state officer or employee from engaging in outside employment beyond ten hours per week. Under the bill, "state officer or employee" includes:

- 1. The Governor;
- 2. The Attorney General;
- 3. The Secretary of State;
- 4. The Commissioner of Insurance;
- 5. The State Treasurer;
- 6. Each person appointed to the Governor's cabinet;
- 7. The public information officer and the chief attorney appointed for the Departments of Administration, Agriculture, Commerce, Corrections, Health and Environment, Transportation, Wildlife, Parks, and Tourism, the Departments for Aging and Disability Services and Children and Families, and the Juvenile Justice Authority; and
- 8. The personal secretary and one special assistant to the Secretary appointed to the Departments of Administration, Agriculture, Commerce, Corrections, Health and Environment, Transportation, Wildlife, Parks, and Tourism, the Departments for Aging and Disability Services and Children and Families, and the Commissioner of Juvenile Justice.

A person who violates this act would be guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

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The Governmental Ethics Commission indicates that SB 14 would have no fiscal effect on state revenues or expenditures.
