**SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2357**

As Amended by Senate Committee on  
Transportation

**Brief\***

HB 2357 would designate a portion of US-169, from the City of Coffeyville north to the junction of US-169 and 3000 Road in Montgomery County, as the 242<sup>nd</sup> Engineer Company – KS Army National Guard – Highway.

The bill would establish the following provisions related to signage for the Highway:

- Require the Secretary of Transportation to place suitable signs to indicate the designation;
- Preclude the signs from being erected until the Secretary has received sufficient moneys from gifts and donations to reimburse the Secretary for the cost of placing the signs and an additional 50 percent of the initial cost to defray future maintenance or replacement of the signs; and
- Allow the Secretary to accept and administer gifts and donations to aid in obtaining and installing suitable signs.

**Background**

Representative Jim Kelly requested the bill and offered proponent testimony before the House Committee on Transportation. His testimony stated the Company is located

in Coffeyville and its service has included two deployments to Iraq and many missions to assist Kansans dealing with natural disasters, such as a blizzard, the Greensburg tornado, and major flooding in southeast Kansas all in 2007. There was no other testimony.

The Senate Committee on Transportation received proponent testimony from Senator Jeff King. There was no other testimony in the Committee hearing.

The Senate Committee on Transportation amended the bill to remove “Memorial” from the designation and to change one endpoint from the “northeastern city limits of Coffeyville” to the “city of Coffeyville” to allow the city and the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) to determine the best locations for signage.

The fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget on the original bill states KDOT reported the agency would need to receive \$6,870 from donations before installing the signs for the 242<sup>nd</sup> Engineer Company – KS Army National Guard – Memorial Highway: \$4,580 for the cost of a set of signs including installation and an additional 50 percent, \$2,290, for future maintenance. KDOT indicated the Senate Committee amendments could reduce those amounts. Any fiscal effect associated with the bill is not reflected in *The FY 2014 Governor's Budget Report*.
