<u>Discussion and action on HB 2572 - Unlawful entry by agricultural inspector, criminal and civil sanctions.</u>

Representative Schwartz moved to adopt a simplified version of **HB 2572**. (Attachment 1) Seconded by Representative Hutchins, the motion carried.

Gordon Self explained that the modified version of <u>HB 2572</u> would make it unlawful for any person to enter the premises of a confined animal feeding facility without maintaining compliance with bio-security protocol and standards submitted by the owner of such facility and filed by such owner with the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. A violation would be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of at least \$100 but not exceeding \$500. The modified version removes the civil penalty provision.

The committee expressed numerous concerns. <u>Representative Schwartz moved to table **HB 2572** and request an interim study. Seconded by Representative Feuerborn, the motion carried.</u>
