Chair Powell opened the hearing on **SB 314 - Kansas Highway Patrol, political activity restrictions.** 

Steve Kearney, Kansas State Trooper's Association, appeared before the committee as a proponent of <u>SB 314</u>. He said that the current statute does not allow members of the Kansas Highway Patrol to participate in any political exercise beyond casting a ballot. He mentioned a letter from Attorney General Robert Stephan from 1984 that outlines activities that are permissible by highway patrol members. Mr. Kearney indicated that the Kansas Highway Patrol should have the same rights to participate in political activity as other officers and employees of the State of Kansas. (attachment #1) Mr. Kearney answered questions asked by committee members.

There being no further discussion, hearing was closed on **SB 314.** 

Representative Hermes moved and it was seconded by Representative Alldritt that **SB 314** be passed favorably from the committee. Motion passed.
