MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION.

The joint meeting of the House and Senate Education Committees was called to order by Chairperson Ralph Tanner at 9:00 a.m. on January 10, 2001 in Room 313-S of the Capitol.

In attendance were Senator Dwayne Umbarger, Chairman of the Senate Education Committee, members of the Senate Education Committee and Sonny Rundell, Chairman of the Kansas State Board of Education and members of the Board.

Opening remarks were made by Representative Tanner, Senator Umbarger and Sonny Rundell.

Introduced was Dr. John Augenblick, John Myers and Justin Silverstein, who each spoke of the comprehensive study done by the consulting firm of Augenblick and Myers on the Organization of Kansas School Districts. (Attachment 1).

Dr. John Augenblick gave a detailed explanation on how data was gathered, what sources were used and how the information was compiled to complete the report.

John Myers explained the charts and maps within the report. He said they were not trying to set the boundaries but to just give guidelines.

Dr. Augenblick closed with the suggestion that: (1) each district hold a public hearing; (2) report their findings to the State Board of Education and, (3) the State Board act on these suggestions.
