Chairman Cox introduced Representative Roger Toelkes as a new committee member and welcomed him and all returning members. He opened the floor for the introduction of bills.

Judi Stork, Deputy Bank Commissioner, requested that two bill be introduced. One relates to changing the name of trust company the other relates to the qualifications of a director of a bank or trust company.

Chairman Cox said without objection the bill would be introduced.

Martha Neu Smith, Kansas Manufactured Housing Association, requested a bill be introduced that would amend the Manufactured Housing Act to provide a process for manufactured homes, on permanent foundations, to have their titles surrendered to the state. It also provides a process to have the titles reissued if the houses were to come off of the foundations and become personal property.

Chairman Cox said without objection the bill would be introduced.

Brian M. Vazquez, Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services, requested introduction of a bill to allow SRS to have financial access. It is based upon a written access by the agency and is specifically limited to individuals who have received public assistance, Medicaid being the big issue.

Representative Gatewood asked what the limited access pertained to. Mr. Vazquez said it pertains to financial records, deposit records and withdrawal records.

Chairman Cox said that the provision used to be law but went into an automatic sunset and that's where it is today.

Chairman Cox said without objection the bill would be introduced.

The meeting adjourned at 3:36 p.m.
