<u>Chairman Mays requested review of HB 2736.</u> Representative Cook offered a balloon amendment and made the motion to adopt the amendment. Representative Powell seconded the motion. The motion passed.

During discussion, **Representative Rehorn made a motion to allow for injunctive relief in** Sec. 3. Representative Powell seconded the motion. The motion passed.

<u>Representative Edmonds made a motion to decrease the penalty to \$100,000. Representative</u> <u>Benlon seconded the motion. During discussion, Representative Burroughs made a substitute</u> <u>motion that the penalty per instance not be more than the wrongful death cap (currently \$250,000).</u> <u>Representative Gilbert seconded the motion. The motion carried 11-9.</u>

<u>Representative Edmonds offered a motion to change the penalty to be not less than</u> <u>\$100,000 but not more than the wrongful death cap. Representative Novascone seconded the</u> <u>motion. The motion passed.</u>

<u>Representative Dahl made a motion to change language to "caused to be shipped or</u> <u>knowingly received". Representative Rehorn seconded the motion. The motion passed.</u>

<u>Representative Cook made the motion to move HB 2736 favorable for passage as amended.</u> <u>Representative Powell seconded the motion. The motion carried.</u>

Chairman Mays requested review of **HB 2737**. **Representative Cook made a motion to recommend HB 2737 favorable for passage. Representative Williams seconded the motion**.

During discussion, **Representative Benlon made a motion to eliminate lines 17-18**. **Representative Cox seconded the motion. Representative Edmonds offered a substitute motion to eliminate lines 17-29. Representative Benlon seconded the motion. The motion carried. HB 2737 was passed favorable as amended 12-7 with Representative Benlon requesting to be recorded in opposition.**

Chairman Mays requested review of HB 2195. Representative Benlon distributed a substitute for HB 2195 permitting Sunday Sales of CMB to be a local option decision by the voters. She made a motion to adopt the Substitute HB 2195. Representative Cox seconded the motion. Discussion included the following items: Representative Powell made a motion to ban all alcohol and CMB sales on Sunday. Representative Dahl seconded the motion. The motion failed 7-12.

Representative Wilson made a conceptual motion to amend Sunday hours to open at 1 p.m. Representative McLeland seconded the motion. The motion failed.

Representative McLeland made a motion to permit closing time be determined by local option. Representative Hutchins seconded the motion. The motion failed. Representative Edmonds made a motion to table the Substitute for HB 2195. Representative Dahl seconded the motion. The motion failed 8-12.

<u>Representative Benlon made the motion to recommend the Substitute HB 2195 favorable for</u> passage. Representative Cox seconded the motion. The motion carried 11-7 with Representatives Hutchins and Freeborn recorded in opposition and Representative Rehorn in favor.

The meeting adjourned at 3:15 p.m. with the next meeting scheduled for March 14, 2002.
