The Chairman opened the meeting at 9:00 a.m. for bill introductions.

By unanimous consent bill will be introduced for exemption from sales and transient guest taxes for the Mid-America Association for Computers in Education as requested by Representative Edmonds. [HB 2201] - Sales and transient guest tax exemption for Mid-America Association for Computers in Education]

By unanimous consent bill will be introduced for the exemption from taxes of transmission lines as requested by Representative Larkin. [HB 2294 - Electric transmission line siting act; application for requirements; notice requirements]
