Steve Rarrick introduced a bill proposed by the Attorney General that would provide protection to Kansans from deceptive and unwanted spam (unsolicited bulk email, or "junk" email) (<u>Attachment 1</u>).

<u>Senator Jordan moved, seconded by Senator Jenkins to introduce a bill that would provide consumer</u> protection from unwanted "junk" email to Kansas consumers. The motion carried. Chairperson Brownlee asked the Revisor of Statutes to draft the bill.

Chairperson welcomed Jerry Niebaum, Planning Coordinator for KAN-ED who presented a review on the status of KAN-ED, a project assigned to the Kansas Board of Regents in the legislative session of 2001 (Attachment 2).
