Chairman Holmes asked for bill introductions. <u>Representative Sloan moved to introduce a House Resolution addressing key issues on broadband deployment</u>. <u>Representative Kuether seconded the motion</u>. The motion carried.

HB 2652 - Unitization of more than one oil or gas reservoir if constitutes a single pressure system

Chairman Holmes opened the debate on <u>HB 2652</u>. Representative Sloan distributed proposed language for new Section 2 (Attachment 1). Representative Sloan moved to replace new Section 2 with the proposed language. Representative Reitz seconded the motion. The motion carried. Representative Sloan moved to recommend <u>HB 2652</u>, as amended, favorable for passage. Representative Kuether seconded the motion. The motion carried. Representative Reitz will carry the bill.

<u>HB 2516 - Incentives to increase electric transmission system and generation capacity; state corporation commission powers</u>

Chairman Holmes opened the debate on <u>HB 2516</u>. Representative Sloan distributed a proposed substitute bill that had been worked on and recommended by the sub-committee (<u>Attachment 2</u>). He explained the proposed changes, section by section, and responded to questions from the committee. <u>Representative Sloan moved to adopt the substitute bill.</u> Representative Reitz seconded the motion. The motion carried. Representative Sloan moved to recommend <u>Substitute for HB 2516</u> favorable for passage. Representative Reitz seconded the motion. The motion carried. Representative Sloan will carry the bill.
